WRA offices hevo bcon instructod to sco that contrallad informetion and sorvico on housing aro availablc. Thoy will also advisc on other nethods of obtaining housing such as gotting financial assistance for purchesc or construction.

CENTRA：OHIO－－1．A busi－ nessman who oums 236 acres of productive land desires an experienced farmer to take charge of the farm． If the applicant hastools． the owner will consider a 50－50 contractarrangement． If the oumer supplies the tools，he will consider a 40－60 contract．Credit to buy seed equipment，tools and pay labor will be adm vanced by the omer．
Corn，wheat，oats，soym－ beans and hay are raited for feeding cattle and hogs which are sold for cash ja－ come．Omer wisizes to add sizeable flocks of chich．ons and turkeys．A year ：sund cash income is secured．trom the sale of mills froa 20 cows．This income is civi－ ded equally betiveen the owner and the tenant．Te－ nant will supervise and be responsible for employ：ent and of meeting payroll of one or two helpers．Excel－ lent housing with comior－ table living quarters is located on the form．There are two houses which could accommodate two large fa－ milies or three small pies．
2．The ormor of a lerge farm located 35 miles from Columbus，Ohio，wants to employ an evacuee who has had some ferm：experience。 He will pay $\$ 100$ per month and includo a tenant house． Farm products including meat，eges，milk and vega－ tables will be supplied for the evacuec and his family， Tomatoes，soy beans，turi． nips，potatoes，and corn are raised on this＇farm。 Turkeys and chickens are raised for cegs and meat for use on the farm。 $A$
