Henry Yamaguchi Gets Favorable Impression Toward Philadelphia

Henry Yamaguchi, onetime block managor of block 11 and interviewer in the Relocation Office, reports favorable impressions of Philadelphia and Cleveland. He recently relocated from Manzanar.

Yamaguchi reports Philadelphia as being a friendly and religious town where no signs of discrimination are shom. He inspected a toy factory and a meter factory in Philadelphia where jobs are offered to Issei, and is particularly impressed with possibilities at the toy factory.

Housing, says Yamaguchi, is probably easier to find in Philadelphia than in other eastern stater, although wage rates are not quite as high there.
The former Manzanite has finally settled in Cleveland where possibilities in the dry-cleaning field seemed to be superior. He says that in Cleveland there are all kinds of jobs to choose from, and that he has gone to work in a place where several Hisei are employod, and that his treatment is excollont. He says he believes public sentiment towards Japanese to be as good in Cleveland as it is in \#hiladolphia.
