The group of six houses at 1936 South Sawtelle Blvd., West Los Angeles. lmovm as tho formerly "Mantaro Kobiyakawa Boarding House", is now operated by Goorge Akagi assisted by Toshiye Ishioka, both rolatives of Mentero Kobiyakawa. All throc managors wore voluntary evacuoes and returned from Denver.

The houses are full, about 30 tonants. The tenants are from Manzanar, Gila and Poston and nearly all are gardoming contractors, sorving expensive homes in the Beverly Hills, Bol Air, Westwood and Santa Monica districts. PLEASANT CONDITIONS

Thoy report pleasant conditions in business and social contacts, with one exception.

On the night of June 21, thoro was a rash of window broaking in the general noighborhood, bolioved by polico after an investigation to be the work of porsons disgruntled over lost gardening contracts. No one was injured, and no suspects have as yot been arrosted as a result of fingorprint tests.

In July, he plans to open another snop for manufacturing synthetic semi-precious stones. In the new shop, he will employ 15 additional workers.

Mr. and Mrs. Kageyama resettled to New York from this center during the summer of 1944. His wife took a stenographic position and he worked in a lapidary shop and made plastic novelties at night until they had saved enough money to start his present business.

ARE YOU WORRIED ABOUT HOUSING? By the Relocation Office

You probably have been wondering about housing, especially if you have a family of children. But you do not need to worry about housing. The Relocation Office has many jobs which include housing. It is not even necessary to go out to look for housing. It comes with the job.

You know that housing is not good in Los Angeles, and that it is hard to find. But in the east housing is better, and, in many cases, it comes with the job.

To find out about these jobs, come to the Relocation Office and talk to one of the interviewers. ewill be glad to show you the new East Coast bulletin which lists a large number of jobs with housing. The area covers New England and the Middle Atlantic states. The cities of Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Newark, and Was.ington are in this new area.

Recently we received a fine offer from Newark, New Jersey with housing to take care of a family that had as many as six children. A family in Manzanar was interested in this job, but they wanted more information. We sent a telegram back to Newark to ask some questions. The next day Newark sent us a telegram saying that a family at Gila had accepted the job without asking any questions, and was already on its way to Newark to take the job. Perhaps they felt that it would be easien to live with a poor icebox than without a house.

We do not want Manzanar families to be disappointed in this way. We want to help you get these jobs with housing. But, in order to get them, you must have yourname at the Relocation Office and be ready to act right away, so that people form other centers will not get these jobs that you want.

When you are talking to the interviewer in the Relocation Office, tell him you want to register for one
of these jobs with housing. Give him the size of your
family, what kind of job you want, what part of the east
you want to go to. We will send this information to
the Relocation Officer in the city you have chosen.
Then, when one of these jobs with nousing comes to him,
he can send us a telegram saying he has a job he thinks
you would like.
