## ARE YOU WORRIED ABOUT HOUSING? <br> By the Relocation Office

You probably have been wondering about housing, especiality if you havea family of children. But you do not neod to worry about housing. The Relocation Of:ice has many jobs which include housing. It is not even necessary to go out to look far housing. It comes with the job.

You lnow that housing is not good in Los Angiles, and that it is hard to find. But in the east housing. is betier, and, in many cases, it comes with the job.

To find out about these jobs, come to the Relocation Office and talk to one of the interviewer. "e will be glad to show you the new Fast Coast bulletin winich lists a laige number of jobs with housing. The area covers $N_{\text {ew }}$ 耳ragland and the Middle Atlantic states. The cities of.Boston, Nev York, Philadelphia, Newark, and Wasington are in this novi area.

Rewently we recelved a fine offer from ${ }^{\text {N }}$ erark, New Jersey with housing to take care of a family that had as many as six children. A family in Manzanar was interested in tais job, but they ranted more information. $7 e$ sentatelewram back to Newark to ask some questions. The nest day ${ }^{\text {ewark sent }}$ us a telegram saying that a family at orla had accepted the job without asking any questions, and was already on its way to Nemark to take the job. Perhaps they felt that it would be easient to live with a poor icebox than without a howe.

He do not want Manzanar families to be disappointod in tris way. We pant to help you get these jobs with housing. But; in order to gt them, you must have your name at the Relocation Office and be ready to act right away, so that people form other centers will not get these jobs that you vant.

When you are talking to the interviewer in the Relocation Office, tell him you want to register for one of thesa jobs witn housing. Give him the size of your family, what kind of job you want, viat part of the east you mant to go to. We rill sonilitils information to the Relocation Officer in the city you have chosen Then, when one of these jobs with nousing comes to him, he can send us a telegram saying he has a job he thinks you nould like.
