TRAIN RESERVATIONS
Wess Hansen, Southern Pacific Passonger agont, statad this meik at iuanzanar that the Office of Defonse Transportation has ordered railroads to make no reservations for train travel more than five days in advance.

Movement of troops to the Westorn Coast and return of soldiers for the European theatyo of Far has taken an avor incriasing proportion of pullma space and heweafter, there will be very little pullman space left for civilians, he stated.

The amy will, slso be given first proference for the use of all railroxd coachos and no reservations for t.is kind of trivel c.an be made more than five days in advance.

Hansen stated that the order of the Office of Defense Transportation is not likely to interfere with the movement of rolocation center residents by coach but, that pư? lman reservations would likely become more hard to obtain.

Ho feels that it might be possible to get pullman reservations for persons who are ill or who have babies in arms, but that it would probably not be possible to get reservations for anyone olse.
Reservations made previously will be honored but no ner reservations will be made.
