FOUR EVACUEES ACCEPTED IN SANTA CLARA UNION

SAN JOSE Four more evacues, two Issei and two Misei, have been accepted for membership in the Santa Clara county local of the Warchousemen's Union and are now employed by the Security Warchouse and Cold Storage Co., San Jose, the San Francisco WRA office announced.

The now members are Harry Dobashi, 26, Thomas Okagaki, 19, Norio Sora, 43 and Morotoni Kinaga, 48.

This nakes a total of six evacuees who have been admitted to nonbership in the union. TWO SPECIAL CARS LEAVE HEART MOUNTAIN CENTER MONTHLY FOR WEST COAST

From the Heart Nountain Center cames the word that the "special cars" errangement for returning evacuees to their West Coast homes is working out woll. So well, in fact, that two specials each month are now planned from that contor.

These special cars are made up for Northern California, Southern California, a car for Chicago and points cast. There are nany advantages: the younger people may accompany the aged and ill, rendering important assistance. This is particularly helpful to Issei who may not have a good command of the English language.

Also, transportation of baggage is oxpedited.

116 RESIDENTS RETURN

TO COAST FROM WYOMING

In the two special coaches of the "Heart Mountain Special" which brought returnees back to their California homes near San Jose recently were a total of 116 men, women and children. Sixteen disembarked at Sacramento.

Another car carried about 50 persons, en route to their homes in Southern California. This car was cut off at Ogden, and attached to a train bound for Los Angeles.

Still another important contingent left the Heart Mountain Center June 18.

Payments have been promptly adjusted and paid in cash, for many years; (3) Auto insurance; fire and theft; liability insurance department being organized, not ready yet but hopes to be able to cover soon, and believe evacuees will be given the same consideration as others. (4) Life, accident, health insurance. (5) All types written on competitive basis, save fire, as above indicated.

SAN FRANCISCO AFL UNION SEEKS JAPANESE WORKERS

What's the attitude of union labor in California?

That's a broad question and cannot be answered in a few words. However, the firm stand taken by the CIO Longshoreman's Union in the so-called "Stockton incident" in insisting on strict compliance with the no-discrimination -duetterace-color-or-creed provision of the Miscellaneous Employees Union 110, AFL in San Francisco. Rated as one of the most progressive unions in the city, already many Issei and Nisei have secured employment as dishwashers and bus-boys, through the aid of the latter.

HAYANO'S TOFU FACTORY ODENS IN MINNEAPOLIS

MINNEAPOLIS -- Mr. and Mrs. Toraji Tom Hayano, formerly of 20-14-E, Heart Mountain Relocation Genter, have purchased a home at 2735 Colfac South in Minneapolis, where they will establish the business of manufacturing tofu for the three Japanese restaurants in Minneapolis, as well as for resettlers here, the Chicago TRA office announced.

The secretary of the union is of Chinese ancestry. Complete absence of racial prejudice is one of the cardinal principles of 110. Proof? Henry T, a Nisei from Topaz, was referred to Solari's Grill, San Francisco's one of leading cafes, by 110. There he went to work, on a friendly basis, with nine Chinese dishwashers! This union is credited in achieving, in large part, a self respecting and decent wage and standard of living for a group formerly grossly under aid.

The union recently and nounced they could absorb 40 to 50 evacuees within the next few weaks. Minimum pay is 90 cents per hour plus meals. All evacuees who apply are referred directly to the hall, union niring and from there to the specific jobs.
