FSA LOAN REQUIREMENTS GIVEN

Before any loan can be made available to returning evacuee farmers, the Farm Security Administration county committee, comprised of three prominent local farmers, must pass on his eligibility, character and integrity, Regional FSA Director R.W. Wollenberg declared in a letter to assistant WRA Director R.B. Cozzens of San Francisco.

Rural rehabilitation or operating loans are available to citizens who qualify as low-income farm families (including owner-operators, tenants, sharecroppers and farm laborers with sufficient family manpower for farm and home operations, except possibly at peak seasons) if certain other requirements can be met.

These other requirements include the necessity of full-time farm operations effectively utilizing family manpower or part-time operations which may be supplemented by off-farm employment that will not interfere with successful operations in order to maintain full employment and a satisfactory level of living; a willingness to assume the necessary responsibilities in order to make an effective contribution to the nation's war effort; a family background of rural experience

PROPOSAL MADE AGAINST EVACUEE DISCRIMINATION

HOLLYWOOD, Calif.-- Mrs. William Dieterle, wife of the motion picture director and chairman of the executive board of the Los Angeles chapter of the National Citizens Political Action Committee, discloses a resolution approved by the committee which declares:

That in view of the careful screening of evacuees and the antagonism displayed by certain interests toward their return to California the committee recommends the following action program:

1. Wholeheart support of the War Department's action in permitting the re-

FBI FIND JAPANESE RECORD CLEANER THAN OTHER AXIS NATIONS

"According to data given by the FBI to relocation authorities, the Japanese have a far cleaner record than the other two nationalities as far as sabotage and espionage are concerned", the San Jose Union Gazette, an official AFL paper declared.

It continued:

"We must bury our prejudice against these American Japanese and give them their proper place in our economic life if we are to maintain a democracy and live up to the constitution and the Atlantic Charter. The manner in which we wish minority groups in other countries treated will depend upon the manner in which we treat them here".

The Gazette also states that the union accepts evacuees who return to the West Coast.

and managerial ability; that the borrower be unable to obtain adequate farm and home financing at reasonable rates and terms from sources other than the FSA; that there be a reasonable possibility of repaying the loan and that the family's level of health and living can be maintained or improved.

Heads of families eligible as standard borrowers can get loans for livestock, farm equipment, minor repairs and improvements for farm and for home, participation in group health, hospital and for dental services, for emergency health services and for correction of physical conditions when the approved farm and home plan indicates that such expenditures are necessary to successfully conduct the family's war production program and rehabilitation of the farm family.

However, loans will not be made for refinancing, generally speaking, although exceptions may be made.

FARM OWNERSHIP LOANS

Farm purchase loans, which run for 40 years at three per cent interest are available to veterans of present war, farm tenants, renters and laborers who are citizens. FSA reports that due to the limited funds on hand for this purpose and the large number of applications already on hand, it is unlikely that more than 12 farm ownership loans can be made in California this year.

less per year during the last five years are eligible for prepaid medical and hospital care through membership in county health associations established by FSA in cooperation with California Physicians Service, county medical societies and local farmers.

WATER FACILITIES

Water facilities loans, which run up to 20 years at three per cent interest, are available to farm families for repairing, rebuilding or constructing farm and irrigation water systems, provided the family cannot secure adequate financing from other sources.

GROUP SERVICES

Group services loans are available to farmers wishing to pool their resources for the purchase and use of services and equipment such as purebred sires and machinery which they cannot afford to own individually. These loans carry three per cent interest and run for a period not to exceed the lifetime of the facility purchased.

MISSIONARY KERR GIVES SERMON IN JAPANESE

WASHINGTON, D.C.—A sermon in Japanese featured a church meeting attended by 30 Issai and sponsored by the Nisei Council for the Issai in Washington recently.

The Rev. William C. Kerr, former missionary of the Japanese Church of Christ, Keijo, Korea, who gave the sermon in Japanese, spoke on the "Kamino Hoiwa" (God's Peace).

The meeting took place in the Lincoln Chapel at the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church on 13th Street and New York Ave., N.Y.

An invitation was extended to the Issai by Doctor Erickson to see Japanese films, including Kabuki and more recent talking pictures produced in Japan every Tuesday night at the Department of Agriculture Building, South.

TELL IMPORTANCE OF TERMINAL LEAVE

"It has become more and more necessary for the employable member of the family to come to Los Angeles prepared to stay," the WRA announced.

It adds:

"If for any reason the returnee feels he must come on short term leave instead of terminal departure, it would be wise to have all arrangements for shipping of personal property before he leaves the center. Too much valuable time has been lost, and sometime the employment, when the returnee is accepted for a position and then must take from one to three weeks to return to the center and pack for the family. After one week there, Mrs. Nakashima entered the employment of a Brentwood Home owner at \$250 a month plus private room and bath.

HAWAIIAN-BORN JAPANESE WOMAN WINS CITIZENSHIP;

MAKES BOSTON NEWS

BOSTON, Mass.--Mrs. Hisano Takiguchi, who arrived in Hancock, New Hampshire, from Topaz last March with her husband, Keikiro Takiguchi, got into the news recently when she was among 250 candidates admitted to United States citizenship in Federal court in Boston.

The Boston Traveler explained that Mrs. Takiguchi was born in Hawaii when it was part of the United States, but married a Japanese citizen before Congress passed the law allowing a wife to retain her citizenship in such cases. She thus came to this country as an alien.

Mr. and Mrs. Takiguchi lived at Topaz, where Mrs. Takiguchi was a kindergarten teacher. They recently visited their son, Wallie, and his wife in Cambridge, Mass. Wallie is a Japanese informant at the Civil Affairs School at Harvard University there. Prior to evacuation the Takiguchi family lived in San Francisco.

TODAS OPERATE HOTEL IN LOS ANGELES AREA

Hikotaro Toda and his wife, Fusao, are again operating the 42-room Sunrise Hotel at 1203 East Sixth Street, Los Angeles, in the old industrial section of town.

Leaving 8-3-A Gila River on April 10, those two Issei returned to the hotel and took over its management from the operator who ran it while they were at Gila. They had to spend \$500 on refitting; and in the meantime, the lease rate was doubled.

turn of loyal Japanese-Americans and condemnation of those who are attempting to divide the American people by developing and stimulating racial prejudices.

2. Cooperation by all public officials -- national, state, county and municipal -- in doing everything in their power to assist the War Department and War Relocation Authority in readjusting these relocatees to community life.

3. Proclamation by the Western Defense Command of the United States Army that acts of violence will not be tolerated, and that it, as a prime mover both in the evacuation and in the return of the Japanese American people, will hold itself responsible for the peaceable reestablishment of those loyal Japanese-American to community life.

4. Administrative ruling by Federal, State, County and Municipal Governments in matters of employment and of licensing by Boards on applications for business permits and all other matters of this kind, so that there shall be no discrimination whatever.

5. Investigation by the Department of Justice, Civil Rights Division, of a conspiracy of certain California officials and the heads of various organizations to violate the civil rights of citizens of Japanese-American ancestry.

6. A statement of position by Governor Warren.

7. Thorough investigation by State Attorney General Kenny, of all acts of violence, and proceedings to punish those guilty of such acts.

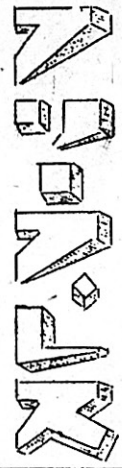

チヨール政策の失敗

ボリスビギ革命後社会対共産主義の勢力は社会主義が緩慢となり軟弱となり譲歩とまでなつた。

近く歐洲の殆ど十ヶ国がボリスビギ共産主義の合作提携の結果社会主義は無意識に政勢を共産主義の先駆者の双肩に委ねられた。

スペインは憂慮に包まれ連大を急進革新運動が華府やロンドンより直接間接の煽動や壓迫に依りフランスの将軍は近く転換の余義なきに至つたが尚左傾歐洲として少く早過ぎると罵つて居る。

英國のアチリイ社会黨政府は露國と接近するをため努力するであらふが外の小國民は様々に拂つて進まスクリン

と争換するだらふ。ボスタム会谈も全く一転しアチリイ首相は世界の運命を荷ふ所網三巨頭の侍或人の第一人者となる。

モスコウ放逐は敵身に溢れて何れの決心を固むるであらうか。英國社会労働黨の勝利は印度の独立に大なる期待を与へるであらう。英國の新政府の勝利は事實上國民の反抗であり國民の覺醒と永き戦争の疾苦の暴露であり歐洲の戦後チヨールは内政問題に就き忘却勝であり政府の渾沌として食糧制限を緩和すべく國民に約束しなかつた。又つて厳しく拘束し管理制度の永続官僚政治除隊の運送岩頭に数時間も俵立させらるゝ数千の主婦達はチヨールが國民の期待を一身に集め一人君として自
