Heads of familites oligi－ ble as standard borrowers can get loans for live－ stock，farm equipment，mi－ ner repairs and improve－ ments for farm and for home，participation in group hoalth，hospital and for dental services， for emorgncy health ser－ vices and for correction of phesical conditions when the approved farm and home plan indicates that such expenditures are néce－ sorry to successfully con－ duct the family＇s war pro－ duction program and rehom bilitation of the farm family．

However，loans will not be made for refinancing， generally speaking，al－ though exceptions may be made．
