JOB OPPORTUNITIES TOLD BY REPRESENTATIVE FROM CONNECTICUT

Edward Peet, representative of the Connecticut Valley War Relocation Citizens' Committee, arrived in the center on Monday to bring information concerning jobs and housing in the Connecticut River Valley and in the cities of Hartford, Conn., and Springfield, Mass., the Relocation Office disclosed.

The representative, who will be in Manzanar until Saturday, states that Hartford has 76 vacancies in modern public housing, that Springfield has 25 vacancies.

Typical of the jobs offered in the Connecticut Valley are as follows:

Housekeeper at Redding, Conn., with wages at \$125 a month plus maintenance. Job No. 68238.

Gardener at Redding, Conn., with wages at \$100 per month plus separate furnished quarters of one bedroom, living and dining room, combination kitchen and bath. Also meat, vegetables, milk and butter furnished.

CANTON CONCERN NEEDS ENGINEERS, DRAFTSMEN IN CLEVELAND, OHIO

CLEVELAND, Ohio—A Canton, Ohio, concern is interested in securing structural or civil engineers and structural draftsmen. They will employ several men with education and qualifications in these skills for structural designing and engineering. Salaries range from \$150 to \$350 per month, plus overtime based on individual qualifications. The management will assist those employed in securing housing.

TEMPORARY HOUSING FOR RESIDENTS OBTAINABLE

Temporary housing in homes of friends and services for individuals or families of Japanese ancestry are now available through the newly organized Berkeley Japanese Church Service Committee, according to Oakland Relocation Officer John W. Lawton.

The sponsors of this newly organized group are the Japanese American Christian groups in Berkeley.

The committee in charge at present consists of the Rev. Jiryu Fujii and the Rev. Masamoto Nishimura with Kichiro Nakajima as manager. Their plan is to arrange for temporary housing in private Japanese American homes at a maximum rate of 50 cents per night. However, special rates will be available for families. For those who plan to take advantage of this offer, it is requested that they furnish their own bed linens.

MORE JOB AVAILABLE IN CAMPBELL'S SOUP COMPANY

Light work suitable for 200 to 300 Issei men and women became available this week when the Campbell's Soup Company of Chicago announced their desire to hire older men and women even though they could not speak English.

Fairly high wages, post war employment, assistance in finding housing close to the factory, laundered uniforms twice each week, a cafeteria with reasonable prices, fine working conditions, a health protection program and bonuses were among the incentives offered.

For 48 hours a week men would average \$42.00 and women \$34.00. With the tomato season ready to begin, much overtime work is in prospect for the next three months. Time and one half is paid for hours worked over 40 in any one week. Double time is paid for work on the seventh day.

A 10 per cent bonus is paid for work between 6 p.m., and 6 a.m., and incentive plans and bonuses allow fast workers to be paid additional money.

Housing is available in the immediate vicinity of the factory and WRA officials promised assistance in locating family quarters. W.W. Lossing, relocation officer in Chicago, cautioned however that the apartments were "not luxurious" but suitable until

LOS ANGELES—Employment cutbacks continue in Southern California but they're largely in shipyards and aircraft plants. Almost no Nisei were employed in those industries, so relocatees aren't directly affected.

The time to relocate is NOW. Every day's delay may be unfortunate.

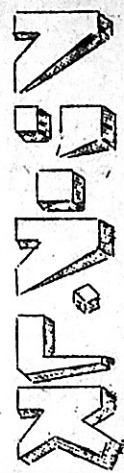
