Manzanar history was made last Monday. In each block, the neighborhood residents assembled in their recreation hallfor their first democratic election to select three potential block leaders.

Vigorous interest was evidenced by bothnisoi and issei alike, marked by heated controversy in some instances. Voting was heavy as citizens deliberated carefully.

From those three, the Camp Manager will choose a block leader and his assistant, on the basis of ability and qualifications Issei were impressed by the dramatic contrast to the treatment that enemy aliens were receiving in other countries.

In some cases an issei, nisei and kibei were elected to give Chmp Manager Triggs ample choice. Final selections will be announced later this week.

MANZANAR WILL CONTRIBUTE TO RUBBER PRODUCTION AS GUAYULE CUTTINGS ARRIVE

Guayulo--that magic name of national defonse came to Ovens Valley as a permanent resident as 100,000 soddlings & cuttings arrived here last Honday morning to be tested for its propagation here, according to John R. Harrison, production ma-Mager of the reception conter.

The Cinderella plant which may oventually solve the serious rubber shortage in this country will be raised in flats under the supervision of Walter Watanabe, veteran issei nurseryman. Plans for construction of a lathhouse to protect them from the wind and said are being rushed and will be completed within two wooks.

Arrangements for guayulo experiments at Hanzaner were made with the Army through Dr. Robert Emerson, and although rooting of this intriguing plant is still in the more experimental stage with 10% success reperted at Cal-Tooh in Pasadena, Watanabe is confident that Japanese skill in horticulture will show good results.

ilany of the Issoi now living in Manzanar started to carn their livelihood in Port Blakely Lubbor Mill.

Aftor the mill had closed, because the trees had been exhausted, the Issei filtorod into Socttle, but somo romained on the island to try their hand at faring.

In the past 30 years, the Japanese have blasted and burned approxi atcly seventenths of the island's. ground to propare the soil for the growth of strawberrios: their principal crop.

Powerhouse Oyama, holding down socond base, banged out two hits to take the batting honor for the opener.
