1. WORK ORDER: Effoctivo' Wedros= day, ipril 22;,1942, no person shall be assigned to duties oxcept upon possossion of work order, Fomn 402, iusuod by Financial Division, Pursomel Scction.
2. TRAMSIER: No porson shall quit a job and apply for anothor without an official rolocso and dismissal by his dopartment hoad and approval by anothor.
3. $A B S E I C E$ FROLi WORK: No person shall be on trio payroll after an absonce of fivo consocutivo dayg. Aftcr ioxpiration of five doy poriod said porson shall not roport to work until issuanco of:, now york ordor.

We arc alroady familior with storios of qualifiod architocts, phamacists, boauticians and othors who woro working in fruitstands of Los Angolos, simply bocauso thoy woro unablo to got omploymont in thoir line. To thom Manzanior offors suitablo work.

Tho Porsonnol Section is moctthoso problans from a human approach, alboit an officiont ono. Intorviowors at thoir offico aro willing to rochock ony provious classification. They undorstand that any so-collod "classification" is a mochanical one atits bost and that bohind oach tabulation must 110 a human story of that personss oxpertionce; education, aptitudo, and spocial proforanco.

And bocause thoir approach is warm and syrpathotic, wo aro cortain that the vast, complex problom of finding wo rk for citizons of Manzanat vill be exocutal in faimoss to NII.
