

## AMERICANS TO LEARN JAPANESE

HARVARD University's new eight-months course of intensive study in reading, writing, and speaking Japanese is training a solected group of 50 hard-working students as America's first crop of translators and interpreters since Pearl Harbor.

Students are expected to be able to read a Japanese newspaper by summer's end, according to Russianborn Dr. Serge Elisseff, professor who has been teaching Japanese for 27 years. The training is proparing young Americans, including one of Japanese descent, to interview Japanese war prisoners, decode captured documents, trap fifth columnists, ovaluate effects of Japanese propaganda.
