Watren revealed that investigations are undor viey of person suspected of defrauding Japanese. - Dockweiler told L. A.County Supervisors that a. thorough investigation of various trangcations was under wny in which mercentile enterprises and farm properties cha $7 \mathrm{~g}-$ ed hands as Japanese were compelled to ovacunte. Prosecutions will follow imediately, he said, in all cases where cariminal or civil of fenses are involved.
