as usual & busy at my office as Governor here Camp.

I sent you wire yesterday. Understood, you applied al-

ready with Roy, by your Nov's letter. I sent many more

letters before Dec.7,which you got on Jan.11 through N.Y.

Did you get them too afterwards? From now on it will be

made possible you to send your letters directly to New

York, I suppose our camp office has sent you a notice ab-

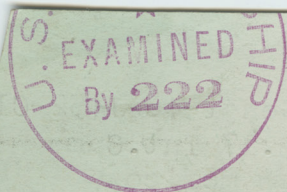

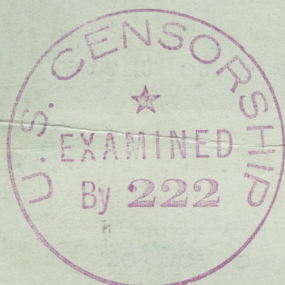
