when leave. Take all things you have with you now. I like

have a suspender, Arm ties, extension cord lamp, if possible.

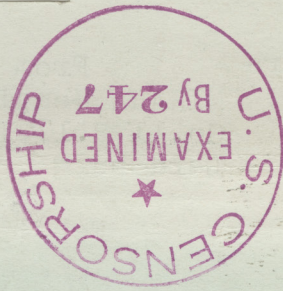

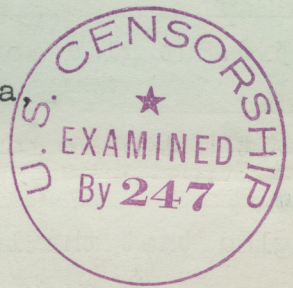
