for their favors. Please give best regards of mine to them.

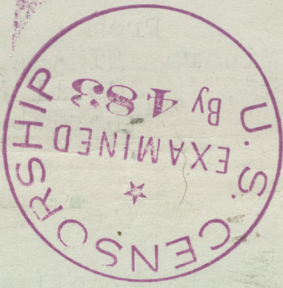

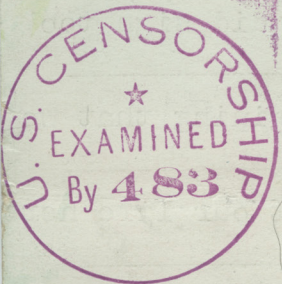
