Cincy Reports Favorable

Reports from the Relocation office and a letter from Taki Asakura show that Cincinnati is satisfactorily absorbing relocators. Although not all have gotten their "dream job" there is no unemployment or wage discrimination. Wages are lower than in boom towns, but housing facilities are more easily obtainable in the better residential districts. 35% of the relocators are members of completed family units. In every case where children are in school, the student report excellent reception.

Many types of jobs are available, ranging from domestics to factory workers. Persons who are capable of being placed in a job are urged to take advantage of the American Friends Hostel. A Citizens Committee is working with the Relocation officer in securing housing. Asakura states he has found excellent housing reasonably.

Trade Schools Open Classes

Classes are now being offered by the Cleveland Trade Schools in Machine Shop and Auto Mechanics. Both classes are offered free of charge by the Government and run three hours per night, 6 days per week until the course is completed.

Machine Operation requires 200 hours for a diploma and the Mechanics course takes 12 weeks to complete. A number of Nisei are attending these schools at the present time and several of them have obtained good jobs through the schooling received.

Those interested in receiving this training are requested to contact the Outside Employment offices.

Efforts will be made to find part-time work in a home or store so that the students will be able to finish their courses.

ASHFORK MOTEL RESERV. PLANNED

Negotiations are under way for relocators to obtain overnight accommodation at Ash Fork. Previously to this, arrangements were an individual matter, but due to some persons being unable to find shelter, the Outside Employment office has taken initial steps to have evacuees stay at the Motel located in Ash Fork.

This is an added service rendered by the Outside Employment office.

1000 RELOCATED AT KANSAS CITY

Latest estimates show about 1000 evacuees relocated in the Kansas City Area.

St. Louis has the most with 345; Omaha is next with about 200; Manhattan Kansas reports 176 in the whole state; Des Moines has 160; and metropolitan Kansas City claims 124.

These estimates do not include so many students; and those who originally relocated to some other destination but later returned to resettle in this territory.

K.C. LIVING COST

Next to Mobile, Alabama, Kansas City has the lowest living costs of any major U.S. city - according to the budget prepared by the Division of Social Research of the WPA. It costs a family of four, \$1541 per year to live at fair standard; as compared to \$1816 to maintain the same level in New York which has the highest rate.

Couple experienced in cooking and housework. Woman to do cooking and part of housework. Man to drive auto, take care of lawn, and do some of the inside housework. The rate of pay will be \$150 per month plus room and board.

KITCHEN HELPER -- Ypsilanti

Opening available for 5 kitchen helper to do general work in kitchen, serve, and work under direction of Caucasian chef. \$200 per month plus food. Room available at \$2.50 per week in boys dormitory located one block from work.

BAKER -- Pella, Iowa

Opening available for worker in hand makeup shop \$30 or more per week depending upon ability. Room can be secured for about \$2.25 per week. Other Japanese-Americans in town.

WAREHOUSEMAN -- Cleveland

Several openings available for men to load and unload freight. Men should be fairly husky. 75¢ per hour with time and a half for all work over 48 hours. Union. Initial fee \$25 and monthly dues of \$2.

FARM DOMESTIC -- Mich.

Opening available for couple if men experienced in general farm and willing to learn. Must be able to drive car and tractor. Woman to do cooking.
