SOLDIER'S FAMILY

Marital Status Must Be Proved

Documentary proof of the marital status of a serviceman or service woman is necessary before the soldier can get family allowances in the class A group, which includes the wife (or husband), child, or former wife divorced, stated Project Director Leroy H. Bennett. Either the soldier or the mate may apply for the allowance and there is no necessity of establishing need.

Under the class B group of dependents, including parents, brothers and sisters, only the soldier can apply, and he must prove he is the chief or substantial support. Each class B case will be judged individually whether or not the persons are dependant upon the enlisted individual for a substantial portion of their support.

Even if a class B case is refused here, it can be re-opened if the family status has changed since the first application or if the soldier's family relocates.

Written application for family allowances must be filed within 15 days after (continued on page 2)

JEROME CENTER RESIDENTS TO MOVE HERE IN JUNE

Between 2,000 and 3,000 newcomers from the Jerome center will arrive here sometime in June, stated Project Director Leroy H. Bennett, who returned here Monday from a week's conference of project directors in Washington.

The rest of Jerome's residents probably will go to Rohwer, Granada, Heart Mountain, and Topaz.

Relocation was very thoroughly discussed during

the one week conference of project directors in Washington during which meetings were held with Secretary of Interior Harold L. Ickes and Director Dillon S. Myer, stated Project Director Bennett. He said everything turned out favorably.

MEET WITH ICKES

The first meeting was held in the conference room of the Secretary of the Interior with Harold Ickes. After the meeting all of the project directors felt that the position of the WRA is greatly strengthened by being put under the Interior Department, Bennett said, Director Myer will continue to work as head of the WRA.

Plans are being considered for group relocation up to six families in any one group, and one member of the relocation staff is working on the location of lands where this type of relocation can be promoted.

The rule governing the poundage of evacuee property which may be shipped at government expense will be increased to 5,000 pounds. Plans are being made to provide for pools of furniture and cooking utensils to take care of people when they first arrive in the large cities until

GILA'S DONATION ACKNOWLEDGED

Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt this week acknowledged Rivers' recent contribution to the Infantile Paralysis fund with a letter of appreciation written by her secretary.

The letter, written on February 29 and addressed to Project Director Leroy H. Bennett, reads as follows:

"Mrs. Roosevelt has asked me to thank you for your letter of February 21 and the check and money order for the Infantile Paralysis fund. She deeply appreciates the thoughtfulness of all who so kindly contributed to these donations."

RELOCATION ADVANTAGES

No advantage can be gained by continued residence in the centers, even for those who plan to return to California, when such return becomes possible, wrote Dillon Myer in a memo to Rivers.

"You can be assured," said Myer, "that center residents do not lose their legal residence in the states from which they were evacuated merely because they relocate. If they intend or hope to return to their former homes when military restrictions

are lifted, they should maintain their voting privileges in those states by complying with the provisions of the state laws governing registration and absentee voting."

Said Myer, "The advantage of making every possible effort to resettle now, and thus establish a place for Japanese Americans in the life of normal American communities, will in turn make for a more likely acceptance by the people of the West Coast."

MYER CONSIDERS NISEI POSITION

Every effort is being made in Washington to improve the position of nisei selective service inductees and their families, stated Project Director Bennett. In fact, he said, every point mentioned in the recent petition, drawn up here and being circulated among draft age nisei, is already being taken up by Director Myer.

the date of entry into active service in a pay status, according to the Handbook for Servicemen and Servicewomen in World War II and their Dependents.

The rates of allowances are listed in the Handbook as follows:

To class A dependents:

Wife but no child, \$50; wife and 1 child, \$60 (additional \$20 for each additional child); no wife but 1 child \$42 (additional \$20 for each additional child).

To class B-1 dependents:

1 parent dependent for chief support, \$50; parent and 1 brother or sister dependent for chief support, \$68 (additional \$11 for each additional brother or sister dependent for chief support); 2 parents dependent for chief support, \$68 (additional \$11 for each additional brother or sister dependent for chief support); no parent and 1 brother or sister dependent for chief support, \$42 (additional \$11 for each additional brother or sister dependent for chief support).

The monthly pay of an enlisted individual is reduced by or charged with \$22 and an additional \$5 if the dependents to whom the monthly allowance is payable include more than one class of dependents.

their own utensils arrive.

It is pretty well assured, said Bennett, that the Farm Security Administration will make loans to citizens, but it will not make loans for aliens.

Cash leave grants will not be increased, but plans will be made to create some agency to bridge that gap, the Project Director said. Under a new type of indefinite trial leaves, an evacuee can go out and stay up to 6 months. Anytime after 4 months he may return and be readmitted, but in this type of leave he must pay for his own transportation. If he takes indefinite leave during his 6 month trial, he will then get his cash grant. Seasonal leaves will operate only for agricultural and from now on, Bennett stated.

LABOR NEEDS

LARGE CITIES LISTED BY WMC

Three hundred and fifty six cities were classified into four groups by the War Manpower Commission on March 1, in order of their need for workers.

Those in group I, which are areas of acute labor shortages where jobs are more plentiful and wages are the highest include, Hartford, Baltimore, Washington, Cleveland, Detroit, Chicago, Rockford, Clinton, and Cheyenne.

Areas in group I I, where jobs are slightly less plentiful include Philadelphia, Toledo and Milwaukee.

On the other hand such cities as Cincinnati, Peoria, and Omaha are in group III where there is a slight labor reserve.

Des Moines and Minneapolis are in group IV which are areas where there is a substantial surplus of labor which is expected to remain for the next six months.

SHELLEY LEAVES FOR WASHINGTON

James L. Shelley, supervisor of community enterprises, will leave today for Washington where he will work for five weeks to help clear up leave clearance hearings. All clearances should be completed by about the first of May, stated Project Director Bennett.

One man from each of the centers has been assigned to help complete the job.

Three Heard For Violations

One defendant charged with violating the traffic law of the Butte community was found guilty.

He was fined \$5 all of which was suspended pending good behavior.

Two boys charged with violating the probation law of the Butte community court were taken before court yesterday afternoon, but were released from custody after close examination by the Judicial Commission.

LABORATORY TECHNICIAN-Neb. Doctor A.R. Macentire of the Physiology department of the University of Nebraska Medical School wishes to hire laboratory technician to take care of small animals such as guinea pigs, rabbits etc., used in experimental work. No previous experience is necessary. Salary without overtime is \$150.00 per month. Permanent employment. Also, private physician in Omaha wants a laboratory technician with some experience in chemistry or bacteriology to assist him in laboratory work.

WAR PLANT CLEARANCES OBTAINABLE IN CENTERS

Evacuees who have special training or skills and wish to work in defense plants but have never received necessary defense plant clearances may now apply for defense clearance before leaving the center, if they intend to seek work in war industries on the outside, stated Wilson Hart, relocation adviser.

The necessary war department questionnaire may be filled out by either citizens or aliens here in Rivers. It will then be transmitted to the relocation officer in the district in which the applicant wishes to work.

Onada Elected To Judicial Commission

George Onoda, Canal school teacher, was elected to serve as the third member in Canal's Judicial Commission, succeeding George Nagamatsu who has relocated, stated Henry Yoshimi, community clerk. Onoda, Dick Seiki, and Frank Sasaki now compose the commission.

Onoda will be sworn in to his new job by the Project Director.
