CANAL DRIVE NETS \$804.52

Seventeen blocks in Canal contributed a total of \$804.52 during the recent war fund drive of the American Red Cross.

Block 27 outstripped the other blocks with a total of \$70.65. Blocks 3 and 10 followed with \$58.90 and \$57.75 respectively.

The general plan is for the election and appointment of block coordinators for each community.

Three eligible persons from each block will be chosen by popular election, one of whom will be appointed as block coordinator by the project administration.

These in turn elect an executive council for their respective communities.

Additional members of the executive council will be elected by each community at large.

SUPREME COUNCIL

Both executive councils will then elect from among their own number a supreme council whose recommendations will be mandatory upon both communities.

Canal will have 17 block coordinators and five members on the executive council.

Butte will have 32 block coordinators and eight members on the executive council.

Five persons will serve on the supreme council.

ISSEI OUTNUMBER NISEI IN HOME NURSING CLASSES

One hundred and forty two persons, of whom 97 are issei are now enrolled in the Home Nursing classes conducted by Catherine Yamaguchi, itinerant nurse.

The students are to receive certificates for 20

hours of attendance, stated Miss Yamaguchi.

This course is to teach individuals how to care for those who are sick at home, and how to recognize the various sicknesses.

This course is free of charge and students are even given the textbooks free of charge, added Miss Yamaguchi. At present the class is learning how to give baths.

Since many of the issei are not able to read English, the classes where the majority of the students are issei, are conducted in Japanese. Besides the text, Miss Yamaguchi uses other materials in her lectures.

Additional classes in Canal will begin after April 10. Those interested are asked to contact Karl Iwanaga, Canal Red Cross, secretary.


BASEBALL MAY BE INTER-CAMP
