CO-OP

CASH REFUNDS START SATURDAY

Cash refunds on the remaining 70 per cent of the Co-op's revolving fund certificates, issued for the fiscal year which ended last June, will be paid to residents beginning this Saturday, July 15.

The schedule of payments for Butte is as follows:

July 15-blocks 73 and 74 at mess 73 from 1:30 to 2:15 p.m.

July 17-blocks 61 and 72 at mess 72 from 8 to 8:45 p.m.

July 18-blocks 59 and 60 at mess 60 from 8 to 8:45 p.m.

Canal blocks will get theirs at their respective block managers' offices as follows:

July 15-block 7 from 1:30 to 2:15 p.m.

July 17-block 8 from 7 to 8 p.m., block 9 from 8 to 9.

July 18-block 10 from 7 to 8 p.m., block 27 from 8 to 9 p.m.

July 19-block 25 from 7 to 8 p.m., block 26 from 8 to 9 p.m.

The remaining schedule will be published in following issues of the paper.

DOCTORS ASK COOPERATION

Doctors, at the last blocks managers meeting, requested that persons with only minor cuts and bruises do not come to the hospital for aid because the quota for each doctor is about twenty cases a day.

If persons abuse this request, individuals needing the attention may be deprived of proper care.

It was pointed out that some residents go directly to the doctor's home to be treated. That must stop.

Ice cream will be sold in Canal from 1:30 p.m. Saturday. Butte will remain the same.

Returning to the project Tuesday, Project Director Leroy H. Bennett stated that beer cannot be sold in this center and Japanese

SPECIAL COACHES LEAVE JULY 20-27

A sufficient number of people have signed up for leave to assure the chartoring of a special coach from Chandler on both July 20 and 27.

There is still room for 18 persons to leave on July 20 and approximately 28 more persons on July 27. When all of these seats have been reserved no more relocators will be scheduled on the special coach for these days since it will accommodate only a limited number.

The remaining seats will be assigned "first come, first served" until the capacity is reached.

AMBULANCES WILL BE TRANSFERRED

Beginning Saturday, July 15, the ambulances will be transferred to internal security, said Hugo W. Wolter. One ambulance will remain on duty 24 hours a day at each of the police stations and be available for emergencies. Transportation of nurses' aides and clinic patients will be handled by special bus service under the transportation office on a regular scheduled basis. All calls for emergency ambulance service should be made to internal security.

THREE INDUCTED INTO ACTIVE DUTY

Tom Teramoto and Edward Aeiizo Inouye left yesterday to report for active duty in the US Army at Fort Douglas in Utah.

Benjamin Ehara left this morning for Fort Douglas.

Said Bennett, "Phillip Glick, solicitor in Washington, is very definite on the opinion that beer cannot be sold on the project because it is located on Indian land."

At the annual conference of the Church of the Brethren held at Huntingdon, Pennsylvania, on June 10, the following resolution was passed:

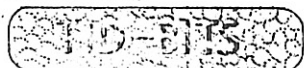

DUNWOODY

TO GIVE COURSE IN MECHANICS

A new intensive course in mechanics is scheduled to open at Dunwoody Institute August 16, according to Elmor Isaksen, Minneapolis relocation officer.

The tuition is \$15.00 a month for the first six months and less thereafter.

The instruction is equivalent to a regular two-year course, but those with a mechanical background and aptitude are able to finish the course within three to nine months. Classes are held from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

In addition, the Dunwoody Institute offers a number of free war training courses in subjects such as welding, electrical assembly and repair, inspection and gauging, machine shop, and mechanical drafting.

TWO PERSONS PLEAD GUILTY

Interior Secretary Harold Ickes announced that plans to transfer citizen troublemakers in Tule Lake to an isolation center at Leupp, Ariz., has been abandoned, according to the Associated Press.

The small number of citizens remaining in the Tule Lake stockade after re-study of the cases made it appear unnecessary to re-open the special center in Arizona, it was explained. There are 25 U.S. citizens being held in the stockade at present.

Of interest to young girls relocating to Chicago is the opening of a girls' club offering board and room. It is sponsored and supervised by the Episcopal Church on Chicago's west side, announced Raymond Booth, Chicago relocation officer.

The club will use part of the dormitory at the St. Mary's School, 2822 West Jackson, just 15 minutes by bus or street car from downtown Chicago. Mr. and Mrs. Kohachiro Sugimoto, formerly of San Francisco, will be in charge.

Applications for reservations may be sent to the school. As accommodations are limited, applications should be made quickly, said Booth.

REC. ASS'N. REASONS ARE MANY-FOLD

The primary purposes of the Butte Recreation Association which was formed sometime ago and which, with its other activities, took over the financial angles of the Butte Baseball Association early this month, is as the following when resolved:

a. To act as an advisory council for the Community Activities Section.

b. To extend full benefits and privileges of membership in the Association to all groups, in the Butte Community, formally organized for a recreational purpose, with properly elected officers, and a regular meeting schedule, who rely on the services of the Community Activities Section.

c. To help exemplify the importance and significance of recreation and its activities.

d. To devise ways and means of raising funds when in emergency and also in fostering adequately the varied activities of all age groups for the center residents.

f. All revenue producing activities shall collaborate to clarify financial statements so when and if funds are desired, appropriate allotments can be provided.

g. To help recommend to the Administrative Office the desirable use of necessary center buildings and facilities to accommodate adequately the needs for community-wide activities.

IT WAS FURTHER RESOLVED that a Board be appointed semi-annually and that the Community Council Chairman for Recreation be ex-officio Chairman of this Board and that he be empowered to select the membership of this Board, and to hold all elections and meetings for the proper conduct of the purpose of this Board.

AND ALSO, that this board shall act in trust for the treasuries of the Member Groups, and shall also receive money for a general Community Activity Fund and determine the purposes for which this fund shall be spent.
