### METHODISTS URGE TRAVEL FREEDOM FOR JAPANESE

Representatives of Methodist churches in 10 western states, Hawaii, and Alaska asserted Saturday that "democratic justice will best be served by granting freedom of movement to loyal Japanese anywhere in the United States on the same basis as the other Americans and aliens of their countries," the A.P. reports under a Salt Lake City dateline.

"This would include," said a resolution adopted by the Methodists' western Jurisdictional Conference, "the right to return to the Pacific Coast."

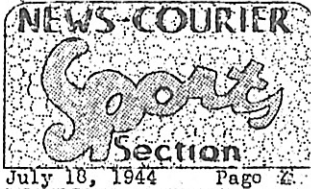
