TRAINING DISCUSSED IN LETTER

In a letter to William Huse, relocation chief, Captain Philip Brandt, of the Army Specilized Training Division at Fort Douglas, Utah, discussed the Army Specialized Training Program as follows:

ing Program as follows:

"In discussing the Army Specialized Training Program, it is desirable to point out that thore are two phases to this program, the regular Army Specialized Training Program, and the Army Training Reserve Program which is a program for members of the Enlisted Reserve Corps between the ages of 17 and 18 year.

"The regular ASTP has been very considerably curtailed within the last few months.

"There are no restric-

tions against Japaness
Americans in this program.
Only enlisted men on active duty in the Army are
eligible for participation.
The ASTRP is a program

which gives college training to young men who passed the Army-Navy Qualifying Tost and are within the age limits set up by the War Department.

"A requirement for participation is enlistment in the Enlisted Reserve Corps unassigned. Such enlistments wore, until recently, prohibited in the case of nisei.

"A recent rule of the War Department, however, provides that Japanese Americans may now apply for enlistment, provided they fill out the DSS Form
