ELIGIBLE PERSONS MAY GET BENEFITS

The Canal social service department will discuss social security benefits with any resident who thinks he is eligible for such benefits.

Aliens or citizens over 65, who have worked under the social security program before evacuation, are eligible for social security benefits. Miss Margaret Thunder, head of the Canal social welfare, stated that these benefits are not relief or assistance payments, but are earned by individuals for having worked under the social security program.

Seven Japanese Named In Suit

U.S. Attorney Charles Carr this week filed suit in the Superior Court in Los Angeles for \$26,422 against seven Japanese creditors of the former Hashimoto Trading Co. in behalf of Alien Property Custodian Leo I. Crowley, the L.A. Times reported.

The Hashimoto Co. was taken over shortly after Pearl Harbor and the seven Japanese defendants assertedly owed it various amounts.

Those listed as defendants are Kiyoshi Kado-naza, Isobei Hatashita, Heisaku Inaba, Hanojiro Ryono, Nisaburo Sumi, Fukujiro Hamaguchi, and Kinzo Murata.

DEADLINE SET FOR CO-OP RECEIPTS

August 26 has been set as the final and official deadline to turn in all Co-op sales receipts or to make any adjustment on the receipts turned in for the fiscal year from July 1, 1943, to June 30, 1944.

ONE-MAN FEAT BY NISEI TOLD

An article in the Arizona Republic by Rembert James describes the capture of 3 Japanese soldiers on Saipan by a Japanese American soldier, Sgt. Heichi Kubo of Lahaina, Maui.

Kubo walked into their cave unarmed and discussed in Japanese the progress of the war, had rice with them and in 30 minutes talked them into giving up.

He found that they were all privates and commented, "I felt a little better when I found that out. At least I outranked them."

One Japanese soldier told an army interpreter that the treatment in American camps on Saipan was "like finding paradise in hell."

Auditors Find Co-op 'Sound'

The Gila Co-op is in a "very healthy financial condition" and should be maintained that way in the future, according to auditors from the Northwest Co-operative auditing and service association, who have completed auditing the Co-op's books for the past fiscal year which ended June 30.

The auditors, G.C. Hofacker and G.R. Greer, stated that printed copies of the audit will be ready about September. The Gila Co-op's Board of Directors has ordered enough copies to distribute to each of the Co-op's block delegates.

METALS CO NEEDS TWENTY WORKERS

Joe Miyamoto, Block 63, who has just returned from six months seasonal leave to Hammond, Indiana, where he was employed by the Metals Refining Company, states that the company is anxious to employ at least twenty more Nisei workers.

Starting wage is 78¢ an hour but workers are raised to 95¢ an hour as soon as they are familiar with the work. Jobs are available on six month trial indefinite leave.

The Japanese boys who have been employed at this plant since the first of the year were instrumental in helping the firm earn its Army-Navy E Permant.

They wish to hire about fifteen men and fifteen women, either citizens or aliens. If they could obtain fifteen families, they would like to employ at least two members from each family. Jobs are also available for any other members of the family.

The company has published a full page advertisement in the county's only newspaper, advising the public that evacuees will be employed in their plant and pointing out the excellent war record of the nisei population both in the Service and in war plants.

There has been no reaction on opposition to this action. The labor unions have voted unanimously to accept Japanese-American members.

This appeared to be the best opportunity offered to date for a group of families to relocate together, with complete assurances regarding employment, housing, and community acceptance, said Hart.

If any group of six or more families is interested in investigating the offer personally, they may appoint a representative whose traveling expenses to Medina and return will be paid.

Butte and Canal All-Stars battled to a 3-3 tie in a practice game held Wednesday night.

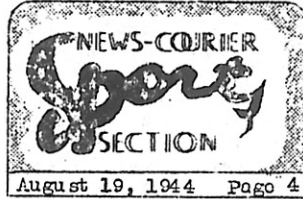
It was in honor of hurler Masato Kinoshita of Butte who relocated.
