### Anti-Japanese Leader Reforms

"When I'm wrong I'll admit it, and I was wrong," admitted George L. Kelley, who was chairman of the "Ban the Japs Committee," last Saturday in Pasadena, according to the L. A. Times.

He and his committee for the past several weeks had bombarded the Board of Education, President Roosevelt, Governor Dewey and General Bonesteel with petitions protesting the enrollment of Esther Takai, 19-year-old Nisei, at Pasadena J. C.

Immediately after his resignation from the "Ban the Japs Committee," he applied for membership in the Committee for American Principles and Fair Play which the night before had sponsored the appearance of Dillon S. Myer, director of the "RA."

"That Dillon Myer fellow convinced me. Why, I have always felt just like they do, only I didn't know it. They practice civil rights. At that meeting the people I'd been bucking invited me to sit on the platform with them," said Kelley.

### NBC To Discuss NISEI GI JOE

The NBC "They Call Me Joe" broadcast of Saturday, October 7, will tell the story of a Nisei boy fighting in Italy, and in a series of flashback episodes will highlight the story of his parents and grandparents, both in Japan and in this country. In an absorbing and dramatic fashion, the broadcast portrays the manner in which the earliest Japanese emigres served ties with Japan and Japanese militarism and embraced American ideals.

In this country, it will be broadcast on the NBC and Blue networks, 7 to 7:30 p.m., Eastern War Time, or 10 to 10:30 p.m. in Arizona.

## JACL REPRESENTATIVES FIRST TO TOUR ATLANTIC SEABOARD

The educational program of the Japanese American Citizens League to bring about a better understanding of the Nisei whereby the public may accept them on an equal basis is entering a new phase. For the first time a tour of the Atlantic seaboard, including the New England states, will be made by a Nisei team consisting of Dr. T. Yatabe, formerly of Fresno, Calif. and now the Midwest representative of the JACL, and Miss Ruby Yoshino, formerly of Alameda, Calif., and one of the most promising Nisei sopranos developed on the Pacific Coast.

The first appearance will be made at Rochester, N.Y., and then at Syracuse. The party will then start a tour of the New England states before appearing before groups around New York City and Philadelphia. Plans have been made for engagements down in North Carolina.

The tour will last for about two months, ending during Thanksgiving week in order that Dr. Yatabe may be able to go to the national convention in Salt Lake City in December.

## HOW NISEI DEMOLISHED NAZI MACHINEGUN NEST

WITH THE FIFTH ARMY, ITALY--Assigned to knock out a machinegun nest that was pouring harassing fire on his company position,

Technical Sergeant Bert M. Tanaka of Koloa, Kauai, with the assistance of his rifle platoon, took less than 10 minutes to complete the mission.

Tanaka fights with the Japanese American 100th Infantry Battalion, then attached to the 34th "Red Bull" Division on the Fifth Army front in Italy.

The machinegun nest lay about 100 yards from them, partially hidden in the wooded terrain. As Tanaka and his men set out, they were met with blistering machinegun and machine pistol fire and were pinned down. Ordering his men to infiltrate around the flanks of the position, Tanaka proceeded to crawl directly toward it. At a given signal from himself, the men opened fire to cover his advance.

When he was 20 yards from the dugout, he opened fire with his carbine, emptied three clips, and then tossed four grenades in rapid succession at the dugout entrance. Combined with the increased
