## TOOELE MEN'S STATUS CLEARED

For the benefit of men between the ages of 18 and 38, whose relocation plans have been delayed because of uncertainty regarding their draft status, a letter from Captain H.N. Kinney, personnel officer at the Tooele Ordnance Depot, clarifies the status of ammunition workers who are engaged in essential war industry with regard to Selective Service their boards .

Kinnov states that Depot workers who have not been inducted into the Reserve Corps Enlisted will fall into four main categories. Those over 30 years and working as ammunition handlers are definitely deferrable. Those. men who have been physically rejected at the Armed Forces Induction Station upon exemination, are definitely deferrable if em- they accept appointment at ployed as ammunition handlers regardless of their age. Those men between the ages 26 through 29 may be considered for occupational deferrment. Men under 26 years of age who are physically qualified military service are for not deferrable.

#### EDITORIAL UNFAIR BUSINESS

The reported ejection of a Nisei war veteran from a barber shop in Parker, Ariz., last week is an indication of what to expect once in a while when some misguided American thinks this country is only for his particular race.

The question of whother the barber, one Andy Hale, shoved the crippled Nisci veteran out of his shop or whether he merely told the soldier to get out is boside the point. The fact is that Mr. Hale discriminated against the American soldier, forcing him to get out and indicating he wanted "all Japs to keep out, wristwatch. Claim at inyou rat." One can't reason with people like Mr. Hale, who has no feeling of appreciation for men who risk their limbs and lives for other Americans. Andy Halo, in effect, kicked the uniform of the U.S. in the pents when he implied that the wearer was a "Jap, you rat."

He may be serving his country by having three sons in the service. But he surely is tearing down at home all the ideals for which his sons are fighting for abroad. If Mr. Hale can't read the papers, he can at least listen to the radio or look at the pictures of how Nisei soldiers like the one he kicked out have fought and are fighting in Italy, France, and olso- please roturn it to the where.

Voteran Ejected At Parker Shop

The WRA reported Saturday that a orippled Nisei Army private, wearing many service ribbons, had been ejected from a civilian barber shop at Parker, Ariz., according to an A.P. release from Poston.

Andy Hale, the barber, acknowledged he had ordered the soldier Thursday not to come in his shop denied shoving or forcing the infantryman. The WRA. said the veteran, walking with a crutch, had been shoved from the establishmont.

Hale, father of three sons in the service, said a sign on the front of his shop reads: "Japs keep out, you rat."

He said it made no difference to him whether the Japanese Americans were civilians or soldiers. "They look just alike to me," he explained.

Pauline: Brown, Poston reports officer, said the soldior wes Pvt. Raymond Matsuda, 29, former resident of Hawaii, who was shot in the knee on the Italian front July 22.

Matsuda stated he went into the shop without noticing the sign and was confronted by Hale, who said, "Can't- you see that . sign?" He replied he hadn't noticed it but even so he was wearing a U.S. Army uniform. Halo then shoved him cut the door.
