4. As full a description as possible of the personal property left on the Island.

HOODLUMS BURN, SHOOT

Unidentified persons in Fresno county last week set one evacuee's house on fire and blasted two other evacuees' homes with shotgun barrages.

The home of Bob Merishige, who before the war operated Selma's largest garage, was set afire and destroyed Friday, Feb. 18.

along with the owner's wife, Misuzu, who were in the house were unhurt.

Earlier in the week, three shotgun blasts were fired at the home of Frank Otski, who had returned to California from Rivers three weeks ago.

The blaze was pronounced as "plainly of incendiary origin" by the Selma fire chief.

Merishige formerly resided in Canal and was the block manager of block 10.

At about the same time that the fire occurred, a shotgun squad blasted a barrage of pellets into the home of S.J. Kakutani at Smith and Adams Ave., on the outskirts of Fresno. Kakutani, his wife and three children, and another couple, Ty and Kay

PVT. MAKOTO YOSHIHARA KILLED IN GERMANY

Pvt. Makoto Yoshihara, 24, son of Mr. and Mrs. Shuji Yoshihara of 47-2-8, was killed in action in Germany on Dec. 22, according to a War Department teletype received last Friday. Pvt. Yoshihara had been reported previously as missing in action.

A public memorial service for Pvt. Yoshihara will be held tomorrow night from 7 p.m. at the Butte High School auditorium.

A native of Guadalupe, Yoshihara joined the Army on October 27, 1941, from Los Angeles, where he was attending an auto mechanics school. He is a graduate of Santa Maria High School in California. He was the only child in the family.

DETROIT HOLDS UNUSUAL SERVICE

An unusual Memorial and Recognition Service dedicated to Japanese Americans in the armed forces of the United States was held the last Sunday in January in the First Baptist Church, Detroit, Mich. The address of the evening was given by Dr. T.T. Brumbaugh, executive secretary of the Detroit Council of Churches, on the subject, "Loyalty to the Highest." A goodly number of Japanese Americans and Caucasians attended the service.

One hundred and seven candles, arranged around the altar, were lighted by relatives or close friends in honor of the absent ones serving either in the Pacific or the European theatres of war. One part of the service was set aside for the thirteen who had been killed in action.

WHAT VICTORY MEANS

Pvt. Isadore Rubin's essay on "What Victory Means to Me" won the \$500 war bond grand prize in the Madison Theater of Operations essay contest, the War Department announced. Essays were submitted by service personnel numbering more than 1,800. Pvt. Rubin's essay follows:

"At the moment, it's difficult to think of victory as meaning anything but an end to fear, to loneliness and death, and a chance to go back to pick up the strands of interrupted lives.

"Henceforth, each simple pleasure, each right we always took so lightly will take on rich meaning. We know what it cost to keep them, and we know too that we've really earned a share in them.

"But victory means much more.

A WORLD DESIGNED FOR LIVING

"With victory, we stand at the threshold of limitless inventions and comforts. We possess the resources to extend our horizons in every field of endeavor and every aspect of human relations.

"However, ancient and stubborn enemies are still to be conquered. Enemies which must be overcome not by armies, but by minds and hearts and talents set wholly free. Such enemies are poverty, insecurity, prejudice, disunity.

"These too shall be conquered. For we have begun to think more deeply and more dynamically. And if we can sweep aside untold obstacles to smash the most ruthlessly efficient machine of destruction ever devised, surely we possess the vision and the practical genius to organize for peace, security, and a world designed for living.

LOOKING FORWARD

"Till now, many have ruled because of accident of birth or power of wealth. But throughout the world, the unfit, the weaklings, and the traitors are falling by the wayside. New leaders are rising from the people--those who never sold their heritage of courage, faith, and simple human dignity.

"With victory, we shall have destroyed those who would have enslaved the world. Our sacrifices have been great, but we have won the opportunity to emerge from the animal kingdom and enter the kingdom of man.

"I look forward to living in such a world."

NISEI FROM HOOD RIVER DIES IN LEYTE BATTLE

Frank T. Hachiya, 25, of Portland, Ore., one of 16 Japanese Americans whose names have been stricken from the county memorial roll by the Hood River, Ore., American Legion Post, died while performing a dangerous volunteer mission, reported the Arizona Daily Star.

Feb. 16. Hachiya, attached to the Seventh Division, was fatally wounded on Leyte December 30. He died January 3 after most of the men in his regiment volunteered to give him blood transfusion.

VOLUNTEER SCOUT
 Lt. Howard Moss, Hachiya's commanding officer said Frank volunteered to cross a valley under Japanese fire to scout an enemy position. The regiment was in a tough spot. Information on enemy disposition was essential. At the bottom of the valley Frank worked ahead of his protecting patrol.

HIT BY SNIPER
 "A sniper let Frank have it at close range," Moss related. "Frank emptied his gun into the sniper. Shot through the abdomen, Frank walked back up the hill. Medics gave him plasma and started him to a hospital. He was operated on immediately but the bullet has gone through his liver and he died."

Hachiya attended the University of Oregon. He enlisted shortly after the Pearl Harbor attack. He had served through the Kwajalein and Eniwetok invasions.

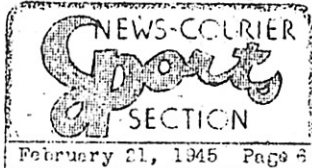
