By direction of the President, the Distinguish ed Service Cross bas been posthumously awarded to Staff Sergeant Kazuo Otani, Infantry, For Extraordinar y hereismain action, on 15 July 1944, Advancing to attack a hill objective, Staff Sorgeant Otani's plate on became pinned down in a wheatfield by concentrated fire. from enony machine gun and sniper positions.

EXPOSED TO BULLETS

Realizing the danger confronting his plateen, Staff Sorgeant Otani exposed himself to enemy fire to shoot a sniper who was firing with deadly effect upon his men. Then, followed by a steady stream of machine gun bullets, Staff Sergeant Otani dashed across the open wheatfield toward the foot of a cliff. From this point, he directed his sen to crawl to the cover of

When the movement of the plateon draw heavy enony fire, he dashed along the cliff toward the left flank. occasionally exposing himself and firing his sub-nachine gun to drow enemy fire from his men. By attracting the attention of the enemy he enabled the men closest to the cliff to reach cover. HELPS WOUNDED

Poaching the rear of the plateen position, he took pertial cover in a shallow ditch and directed covering mon who had bogun to movo forward by fire for the leaps and bounds.

At this time one of his mon bocame seriously wounded. Ordering his men to remain under cover, Staff Sergeant Otani crawled to the wounded soldier who was lying on open ground in full view of the enemy. Dragto a shallow ditch, Staff wounded soldier ling the Otani proceeded to render first aid treat-Sergeant ment, but was mortally wounded by machine. gun fire.

The dauntless courage and inspiring leadership exhibited by Staff Sergeant Otani exemplify the highest traditions of the Armod Forces of the United States."


