SHOTS FIRED AT RANCH HOME OF GILA RETURNEES

Another shooting was added to the string of California's as yet uncontrolled terrorism when four rifle bullets were shot into the wall of a bedroom occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Masaru Miyamoto, former Gilans, who recently returned to their home on a 75-acre vineyard east of Selma. The shots were fired early Sunday morning, May 20.

Deputy sheriff Hubert Nevins, according to an A.P. report; said two of the bullets narrowly missed Mrs. Miyamoto, and the others passed through a wall about seven feet above the floor. C. Fred Lane, Fresno WRA officer, stated officials are investigating.

Mr. and Mrs. Miyamoto and two small children lived at 26-B-C in Canal before returning to Selma early this year.

FORMER GILAN DIES IN ACTION

Pvt. Yeichi Hiyama, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. Hiyama, formerly of Canal and now relocated to Fowler, Calif., was killed in action in Europe according to word received here this week.

Pvt. Hiyama graduated Fowler High School in 1935. He entered active duty on Feb. 17, 1942, and trained at Camp Shelby, Miss., before shipping out. His wife is the former Patricia C. Iwai of Del Rey.

Evacuees Urged To Visit Coast

Center residents are strongly urged to visit California to see for themselves the conditions there, according to Esther B. Rhoads, member of the American Friends Committee, who returned to Pasadena yesterday after visiting two days. More than 600 evacuees have passed through the Evergreen hotel in Los Angeles, and some 150 through the smaller Pasadena hostel, she stated.

Single persons have no trouble finding housing and jobs, she stated, but family groups are having more difficulty, some taking more than a month before finding housing.

The Los Angeles area has had no anti-Japanese incidents. There are 12 students attending U.C.L.A. and the same number in Pasadena J.C.

EARN RESPECT**

Under the heading "Respect for the Nisei," the newspaper PM featured on May 15, a letter to the editor from a United States soldier stationed in the Pacific Theater, Daniel Bagatello, in which he declared that "the Nisei is as American as the Statue of Liberty itself." The soldier also said that "all of us who have served in this war with American Nisei feel very strongly about the discrimination that has been directed against Japanese Americans.

"The Japanese Americans do not want pity nor do they want people to 'tolerate' them," he wrote, "for these are the grossest insults that can be paid to persons with self-respect. All they want is the respect entitled to them as brother Americans which they so rightfully deserve."

SHAMEFUL VIOLENCE

(The Milwaukee Journal, May 17, 1945).

Even the stinging phrases of Curmudgeon Ickes are inadequate to properly condemn the lawless attacks on the property and persons of Americans of Japanese descent who have returned to homes and farms on west coast. It is shocking and scandalous that these Americans should now be subject to abuse and terrorism when they attempt to resume their pre-war occupations in their home communities. Their kin have been among the bravest to wear their country's uniform. They themselves have been subject to dislocation and loss because of war conditions and war prejudices entirely beyond their control.

TERRORISM UNPUNISHED

The hoodlums who perpetrate such "planned terrorism" are a lawless minority, as Secretary Ickes says. It is probably true that such actions are condemned by "the decent citizens who make up the overwhelming majority." But the fact seems to be that, while the method would hardly be condoned by these decent citizens, racial prejudice is so strong and so general that there is little inclination to expose and punish those who resort to violence in an effort to expel these Nisei.

In other words, the west coast hoodlums are the same mold as the lynching mobs that whipped and burned and terrified southern Negroes, and the present lawlessness goes largely unpunished for the same reason.

NATION'S DISGRACE

Secretary Ickes' blast is good enough as a method of focusing attention of the rest of the country on the rank racial discrimination of some of these western communities. It is much to be hoped that the western states and local governments, to uphold their own good name, will put an end to such persecution of a racial minority. Further, the situation should serve to emphasize the extent to which racial discrimination still exists in fair America and the extremes to which it loads.

As Americans, of every racial background, side by side, lay down their lives for democracy on the battlefields of the world, as Americans pray that democracy shall be extended to the benighted and the oppressed nations of all the world, let us give thought to bringing the full blessings and full justice of democracy to all Americans, in all America!

EDITOR SAYS:

NISEI DESERVE EQUAL RIGHTS

The Arizona Daily Star, ever vigilant in advocating equal rights for all races, came out on May 20 with an editorial citing the record of Nisei soldiers and pointing out that they deserve the basic rights of American citizenship.

After quoting photographer Joe Rosenthal's statement on the proven loyalty of Nisei soldiers, the editor of the Star states:

"These (Nisei soldiers) are the men whose families are being pushed around by some of our 'super-patriots' at home who have never heard a gun fired in anger. Their record should be guarantee enough of the basic rights to which they and their families are entitled as American citizens, regardless of ancestry."

Work for the upkeep of the hostel will be done cooperatively by everyone. Guests without jobs must pay \$1.00 a day. Those employed \$1.50 a day. Each person is required to bring his own linen, soap, pillow case, and ration book.
