## HOSTELS

### **Freight Not Accepted**

Thomas Reynolds, evacuee property officer, stated Relocators are again reminded that hostels do not have the space to store household goods and furniture. Those who give a hostel as a shipping address will run the risk of having to pay for private storage of their belongings as the government will not handle this cost.

Evacuees can leave their crated property on the project in storage for a short time until they are located and have a place to have it sent. At present they are permitted to leave it in project storage for 60 days. Of course this length of time will soon have to be less than 60 days because the center will be closed and there will be no one to handle the shipping.

### **LEAVE REGULATIONS**

Visitors wishing to leave the project must follow the following procedures in order to avoid unnecessary confusion and delay:

1. Take your Incoming Visitors Gate Slip to the Agent Cashier who must approve this paper before you will be permitted to leave the project.

2. Bring the above paper with you to the bus or gate when you leave.

Any visitor who expects to leave on the special busses that leave the center at night or on the special railroad coaches that leave Chandler must make reservations one or two days in advance.

The former Buddhist Church in Dinuba, California has been opened as a hostel on September 7, according to a telegram received from Robert M. Cullum, relocation officer in Visalia.

### **Two Die In Train Wreck**

Casualties of two deaths and three injuries in the Santa Fe Train wreck which occurred at Arcadia, Calif. on Sept. 4 were made known to the project by Paul S. Robertson of the Los Angeles WRA office.

The two dead are Nobuo Itano, age 57, and Yoneji Yasutomi, age 61, both from Route 1, Box 415, La Habra, Calif. and Poston Center.

The three injured are Pvt. Dick I. Kizuka from Poston Center who received minor injuries, T/Sgt. James S. Yoshihara from Chicago, Illinois who received minor lacerations and sprained ankle, and Kana Yamagawa with minor head and stomach bruises.

Stowell Sandmeyer a caucasian WRA employee from Poston also suffered slight injuries but has already been released from the hospital.

## SUNDAY

### **FINAL YBA SERVICE**

Tomorrow evening's service will be the last regular service to be conducted by the Butte YBA until the center closes. This was decided suddenly by the Cabinet in view of the rapid relocation of YBA members in recent weeks.

The Reverend D. Suzuki is scheduled to deliver the sermon at this final service which is to start from 8:00 p.m. at Temple 42.

There are some more song books recently published by the organization available to those who did not receive them. Members in attendance at the service may get them free.

## Obstetrics To Close

James L. Shelly, assistant project director, states that there will be no obstetrical service at the hospital after Oct. 5. Mothers who are expecting babies after that date should make plans immediately so that they can get transportation while they are able to travel and make arrangements for care on the outside.

### **REMOVING OF HANDLES**

## DETROIT

Ruth Araki formerly of Gila and Santa Maria and Kanako Fujishige also of Gila and Stockton were married August 26 at Central Methodist church in Detroit according to the Weekly News Service received from that city.

Reverend Oscar Starrett performed the ceremony. Jimmy Tanaka was the best man and Faye Toyama, formerly of Gila, was the bride's attendant.

While in Gila, Ruth was a prominent member of the News Courier staff. She was also an active leader in the YWCA circle.

## DATA: COAST RETURNNEES

The Statistics Section of the WRA in Washington, D. C. just recently issued the first in a series of reports entitled "Returns to West Coast-City-Cumulative" which summarizes the number of evacuees who have returned to the West Coast by state, county, and city of destination.

Report No. 1 covers a period between January 1 to June 30 of this year and gives an interesting data of terminal departures from WRA centers (including conversions) to the evacuated portion of the West Coast. Of the total of 4,922, 4,225 persons have returned to California. Returnees to same city totaled 3,151 for the whole coast, and of that number 2,641 were from California.

Los Angeles County led all in the number of resettlers with 1,107 persons. Fresno County was second with 867 persons followed by Santa Clara County with 413.

### NEW APPOINTMENT MADE

John K. Brenton was recently appointed to succeed William Kir-Stimon as relocation officer for the Greater Illinois District.

Brenton, who has been serving in the Chicago district since August, 1943, came to WRA from the office of Civilian Defense. He will be responsible for further developing the city-town relocation plan, which offers families with small children job-housing opportunities in and around Chicago.

## COLUMBUS

### Family Hostel Opens

The Friends sponsored Columbus Hostel has been opened for family occupancy from September 1. Located at 627 South Lazelle Street this Hostel is only five minutes by bus or street car from the business district of the city.

The Hostel has a fully equipped kitchen, dining room, a large living room, bathroom and two large bedrooms. The Hostel is newly papered, freshly painted, and furnished comfortably. It will accommodate two large or three small families until permanent arrangement can be made for living quarters. Families will do their own cooking by obtaining food from nearby stores.

A fee of \$5.00 a week will be charged for a family unit.

## BROOKLYN HOSTEL

### REPORTS FAVORABLE

According to a report released by Dr. J. Henry Carpenter, vice chairman of the Japanese-American Resettlement Committee of Brooklyn, the Brooklyn Hostel accommodated 717 Japanese-Americans of all ages including 407 who had come directly from relocation centers, during the hostel's first year of operation.

The average stay of a hostel resident is nine days, and the hostel's capacity of 25 persons was almost always full through the war.

Persons of many skills have been among the temporary residents of the hostel including beauticians, silk screen artists, dress designers, engineers, accountants, students, gardeners, nurserymen, domestics, secretaries, seamstresses, mechanics, draftsmen, printers, shipping clerk, produce managers and cooks.

## SAN FRANCISCO

### Navy Man Backs Nisei

Los Angeles News dated August 29th carried an United Press dispatch from San Francisco describing how a navy man backed up the nisei machinist Takao Miyama who was recently discriminated by the Municipal Railway Shopmen. He is Chief Radio technician Harold Stone of Aircraft Carrier Franklin.

The story quotes him as having said, "I didn't go out to fight in the Pacific so people with different colored skins would be discriminated against when I got home".
