The two were delayed by. the unusual storm conditions on the coast.


# Canteens Cash Personal Checks

## SOLDIERS DENIED JUSTICE

The significant portion of the Bitte JACL's memorial to the National Emergency Board reads as follows:

"...take immediate steps to restore to American Citizens of Japanese Ancestry now serving in the Ammed forces of the United States all rights and privileges of American citizenship. We specifically request for them the right to travel freely in all parts of the United States as any other American."

Whether such memorials will produce results or not, is a moot question. But it is a reminder that men who have dedicated their lives to this nation are not permitted the same rights that ALEMS of other nationalities are entitled to. It is a reminder, too, that these very soldiers are denied free access to relocation centers in the military zone to visit relatives and friends——a consolation that by any standard of human decency should not be denied them. ——JN

## FIREMEN, DOUSE THAT FIRE

Irresponsible members of the community are needlessly depleting the supply of serap wood sorely needed for the wood stoves in the partitioned apartments in the colony.

Every morning and every evening fires are seen in various blocks and elsewhere. With oil heaters now warming the apartments, this is a useless waste. It is a deprivation of heat source to people not as fortunate as the vast majority with the handler oil heaters.

Block Councils and Block rangers have been requested to inform their block residents to cease this practice. But it is the people themselves who must realize that follow evacues will suffer, should the supply run out.

Fresident Recevelt and Winston Churchill returned this week from a secret meeting in North Africa. The announcement was not made until they had returned in their respective capitals. What they decided may determine the future of the world for generations.

Villico has given every indication that his is a world view. There are many who suspect that Wheeler, on the contrary, is against whatever Roose-velt is for. The people have the final voice in determining whether pettiness or statesmenship shall write the final beace.

Harvest of winter vogetables continues apace. In aid harvest now are 26 acres of broccoli, and 43 a cres of cauliflower. Still being cut are 60 acres of cabbages and 59 of lettuce. In smaller acreage, carrots, turnips, and nappa are available for mess hall talbes.

Planted and available for center menus over a period extending three months are peas-58 acres, beets-17, carrots-18, en-dives-5, nappa-12, swiss chards-6, cabbage-8, corn-5, celery-9, lettuce-50, and green onions-2 acres.

Seed beds have been prepared for tomatoes for transplanting after danger of frost is over.
