## REVISED RULING OPENS MILITARY ZONE ONE TO NISEI SOLDIERS

## 'NO STRINGS' ON FURLOUGHS

Nisei soldiers may now apply for entry into War Relocation Centers or into Military Zone 1 without qualification, declared Captain Norman Thompson last night before Butte center leaders.

It was disclosed that the WRA and Army ruling which denied missi soldiers entry into relocation conters except in extreme emergency had been revised in December. There are "no strings attached" to furlough leaves to centers now, said Thompson.



From bloody Stalingrad 300,000 Nazis comes word: have been lost to the Russian armiest

All of Germany will observe three days of mourning for this colossal defeat.
