Anthropologist Discusses Group Relation Problems

Speaking from the viewpoint of as cultural anthropologist, Dr. R.H. Lowie of the University of California, addressed a packed hall of young people on the topic, "Group Relation," Wednesday night at the Butte Buddhist Church.
