telegram to Captain Norman H. Thompson:

"The question that has arisen most frequently is "Why is a segregated unit being formed and will the combat toam fight in the same battle areas with Caucasian troops." The Secretary of War had directed that the following reply be brought to the attention of all Japanese Americans within your conter. "It is only because the War Department desires to aid the loyal Japanese Americans that a separate unit is being formed. Millions of people are not familiar with the Japanese Americans. By forming an all Japanese American combat team on a voluntary basis the American people will be presented with incontro-.

HISTORY SHOWS PROGRESS

In their present status as citizens in exile, nisei tend to forget certain truths which makes the United States a nation of hope. Many feel that they have been persecuted, so they harshly denounce the country for not practicing its ideals. Yet, history shows that this land has been one long uphill battle (with lapses, to be sure) for greater rights for its people. History shows, too, that there is yet to be a nation with democratic ideals which has not had its hyporricios.

With the approach of Washington's birthday, (Monday, Feb. 22) there is no better time to roflect on the great accomplishments that have successfully pulled through despite overwhelming odds to an ever higher level of humanity.

Like all nations and communities America has been beset by die-hard reactionaries who have restrained the progress of liberalism. Washington and his compatriots freed the nation from the economic and political oppression of England in face of Tory insurrections. Lincoln, to mention another giant, freed a tenth of America's population from bondage. And history tells little of the unsung heroes who have , minute step-by-step, led America from the tight aristocratic semi-democracy to a more liberal land that it is today. They gave poor man a vote (except in some southern states); suffrage was granted to women; free public education was brought in; rugged individualism and the resulting wastage and unfair business tactics were curbed; living standards of the masses were raised -- these and other achievements have been recorded in history.

Yes, there are iniquities, plenty of them (where is there none?) But who can deny that there are few nations which have given more to its people in the way of human dignity and still maintains it, then has the United States. It is a land worthy of the support of all liberal people of the world, not because it is perfect now, or may ever be, but because its stronds have more future possibilities for the kind of a country that they seek than any other nation on the earth.
