**OVER 100 NET
WORKERS WANTED**

With over 500 workers employed, the net factory lacks only a little over 100 workers of its employment capacity, stated manager Thomas Reynolds.

Last week, the workers nearly hit the 1,000,000 square feet mark, when, on Tuesday, production totaled 949,000 square feet, an average of over 1,900 sq. ft. per weaver. Since that day, production has slumped a little, said Reynolds.

Quoting figures relative to wages, the manager revealed that an average of 1,900 square feet over a period of a month will net a worker about \$110.00 or \$55.00 per bi-weekly pay day.

Wage Plan Being Mooted

Whenever questions of wages are involved, particularly when talk of wage cuts are in the air, it is a source of gripe, discontent, and agitation among the workers affected. Thus, it is not alarming that camouflage net workers appear upset over conferences now being held to change the present wage scale.

Yesterday, it was reported that several workers had quit in protest. When negotiations between the committee appointed by the Community Council and the committee representing the factory hands are yet in a very indecisive stage, this is foolish.

A plan has been submitted by the Community Council Committee to the workers for considerations. It calls for a reduction in the net earnings of net workers. The average net worker will receive under this plan, more than three times as much as the WRA worker who will receive approximately \$24 (\$16 plus \$8 from trust fund) for living under the same conditions and receiving same services and working five days a week.

But this plan has not been approved, despite the rumors to the contrary.

Important thing to bear in mind is that the net plant is one of our bids for favorable publicity, and nothing to jeopardize the production record of the plant should be done. Most of us who work on WRA jobs either liked our present jobs too well or disliked the hard physical labor involved in the work at the factory. We have no right to raise a fuss. On the other hand the net workers can work at the plant only because the balance of the workers do the necessary work which make the center livable.

In the negotiations now going on for a satisfactory solution to the problem, these factors must always be considered.

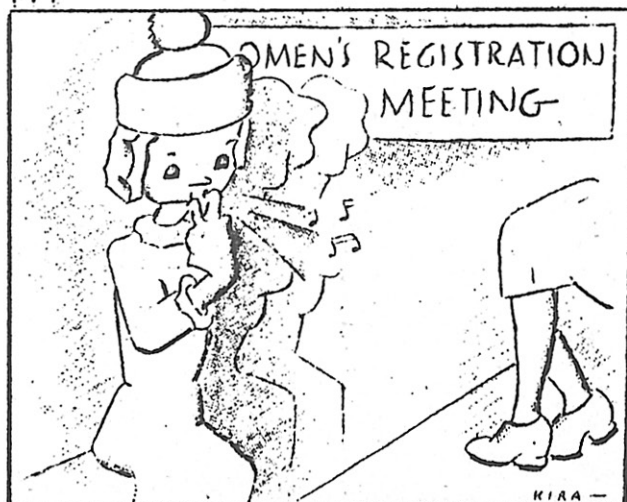
Parcel Post Hour Changes

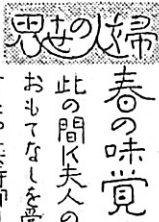
