GILA POSTON IN FREE ZONE; ARMY LIFTS RESTRICTION

Most of Arizona Now Open

Gila River and Colorado River Relocation Centers, and much of Arizona's restricted zone will become a non-military zone tonight at midnight by the order of Lt. Gen. John L. DeWitt, Commanding General of the Western Defense Command, announced Project Director Leroy Bonnett yesterday afternoon.

Roughly, a strip 50 miles wide was released from the restricted zone by the order, leaving Gila well within the free zone. All of Pinal County, in which Rivers is located, lies north of the new line, outside of the restricted area.

Cities now open to people of Japanese ancestry include among others, Phoenix, Tempe, Mesa, Coolidge, Prescott, and Casa Grande. Tucson, Arizona's second largest city is south of the line.

Evacuee May Return Home

"Approximately 245 persons evacuated from the area now removed from the evacuated zone in Arizona will be allowed to return to their homes immediately," teletyped D. S. Myer, IRA Director, to Project Director Leroy Bonnett, following the Western Defense Command which opened a part of Arizona's restricted zone to persons of Japanese ancestry.

The teletype adds, "The new development fits in with the past developments of leave policy and army enlistment—it is still another step toward re-establishing normal life to persons of Japanese ancestry evacuated from the west coast."

IN LITTLE TARO'S MIND

Teacher asked Taro why he hadn't brushed his teeth that morning. Taro had always had sparkling white teeth, a result of assiduous brushing every morning and evening. Why then was his teeth becoming dull and stained?

If Taro were a frank young fellow aware of the failings of men instead of sitting shamefaced in his seat, he might have answered thusly:

"Teacher, we have no tooth powder at home. The canteens are out of them. Whenever a supply comes in, many people make a rush and buy off a large supply instead of buying what they need. They don't realize or don't care what happens to the less fortunate who either were not aware that a supply had come in or didn't have the money to buy it more than barely enough.

"People are also hoarding soap. I know of some people who have laid aside enough to last a year or more. Without a question, soap and many other things will not be as plentiful as they used to be. There will be many of us who will suffer for unheeding selfishness of people who buy more than they need.

"I realize that it is a very human weakness to make the future secure. But in a community of this nature, I thought that people would think more in terms of the whole rather than the individual."

So he might have answered with truth. There has been a great deal of talk of people suffering a common plight in these centers, but apparently, no real spirit of unity has come.

Ration Book Arrangements

Drastic curtailment in the production of consumer goods has wrought its changes in the community stores.

The shoe store remains closed. With a long range view of the situation, Washington WRA office and the OPA is working on a procedure to eliminate as much as possible the inconvenience now being suffered by the center. In the meantime, John Landward, administrative assistant is working out a procedure whereby evacuees urgently in need of shoes can make a special application to the Coolidge, Arizona, ration board.

"Sennin-Bari" With This, My Soldier.

Many of us are wondering where mom goes nowadays--well, it's like this:

The "sennin bari" or thousand unbroken stitches, an old Japanese custom, has made its appearance in the Gila colony in great numbers.

Many a nisei soldier will be a happy recipient of this coveted symbol of love, each knot tied firmly and individually by one thousand girls and women--all with a single prayer in their hearts that the soldier recipient of the sennin bari will fight for his country with the might only his country and his people will understand and appreciate.

While those born during ordinary years take but one stitch on the white cloth which is usually a waist band or vest, women born in the year of the Tiger take the number of stitches equivalent to their age, therefore wishing more strength onto the soldier while in battle. To many, this may be only a superstitious feat, but to those mothers who have sons in the United States armed forces, a more sincere way of showing their love is not to be had. It is the only way in which she can let her sons know that she is with him and also that within the sennin bari, a thousand prayers are stitched--each prayer direct from the heart of the home-guardians, the women left behind, to spur him on to brave deeds on the battlefield to make our country, America, a safe and free place to live. MONEY SAVING PROPOSITION

DAIRY, POULTRY, HOG, PROJECTS

Savings of tens of thousands of dollars to the government will be effected when the newly approved construction on the dairy, hog and poultry farm are completed, and the projects are operating as per plan.

Approval has also been sent in for the bakery and carpentry, plumbing, and electrical shops.

Dairy farm will include a milk room, cold storage, machine room, sterilizer room, wash room, dressing room, and office. Construction for the hogs will be 75 farrowing houses, 10 portable hog houses, 25 self feeders, 35 garbage feeding stations, 2 warehouses, and shelters and waterers. Two huge 20' x 40' laying houses, 20 portable brooder houses and a warehouse will house the hens.
