TOPAZ SEAMEN MAY APPLY FOR GREAT LAKES WORK

Residents who were formerly members of a seamen's union on the Pacific coast as merchant seamen, fishermen, and galley cooks and desire employment along these lines may register at once with Ferdinand C. Smith, national time Union, 346 West 17th Street, New York City. At present the only area open for such work will be in the Great Lakes region.

The CIO National Maritime Union office in Chicago also advises that such candidates should register with Jack Lawrenson, vice president, National Maritime Union, 317 West Fort Street, Detroit, Michigan, and mark the letter "Hold", according to a communication to the project director from Elmer L. Shirrell, relocation supervisor.

The letter also states that the season will open within 30 days and those interested are advised to get on these two lists. Tersons interested should also apply immediately for registration in Dining Hall 1 and contact the employment office for further information.
