



HEALTH PLAN OUTLINED BY COMMITTEE

A complete program of Public Health for Topaz was outlined Wednesday night at the regular February meeting of the Health and Medical Care Committee of the Community Council. The meeting was held at the hospital with the hospital staff and a number of invited guests present. Charles F. Ernst, project director, presided as chairman.

Comprehensive in their scope, the plans take into consideration further improvements in the total health and medical care program, including public health education, food handling and sanitation.

The next meeting of the committee will be held in March.
