WAAC MAY BE OPENED TO CITIZEN WOMEN

The opportunity to discuss possible service with the Women's Auxiliary Army Corps will be presented to young women citizens of Topaz, with the arrival here during the next week or 10 days of a WAAC lieutenant, it was announced today by Lt. W.L. Tracy, head of the War Department team. The WAAC officer will be available for interviews with those interested.

There is also a possibility that registered nurses among the residents may be utilized for service with the Army Nurse Corps, Lt. Tracy said, following a telephone conversation with the War Department.

Lt. Tracy emphasized that the coming of the WAAC lieutenant is only for the purpose of determining what interest there may be in the WAAC among resident women.

YOUTH PROBLEMS CITED BEFORE CITY COUNCIL

Problems of youth delinquency were cited by LeGrand Noble, superintendent of schools, at the regular Community Council meeting last Thursday afternoon. He declared that it was of paramount importance that immediate preventive measures be instituted before serious delinquency develops among the young people of Topaz.

Fundamental prevention methods discussed were increased recreational activities. Plans for the construction of tennis courts, baseball diamonds, a small track, sand boxes and an outdoor school bandstand were revealed by James E. Lamb, head of the Community Activities section.

Henry Tani, a member of the youth guidance committee and also junior administrative assistant to the Education department, recommended the creation of a juvenile board to function as a fact-finding body on cases involving youths.

EFFICIENCY AWARD GIVEN TO DINING HALL

At a formal ceremony led by Project Steward Brandon Watson last Saturday afternoon, the first Topaz "E" pennant was raised over Dining Hall 37 in recognition of the efficient work performed by the kitchen crew under Chef Frank S. Nakatani. At the ceremony were Roy Potter, chief of the Transportation and Supply division, Assistant Project Director James F. Hughes, Watson, G. Nakahiro of the resident stewards group, the staff of Dining Hall 37 and a large gathering of residents.

Similar to the coveted "E" flags flown over certain war plants rated as being efficient by the Army and Navy, the pennant was made by a high school sewing class under Mrs. Marguerite Hudson as an award to the best kitchen south of the school area.

The award was made to Dining Hall 37 on the following qualifications: 1. Consensus of opinion among the block residents as to the quality of cookery; 2. Honest food distribution; 3. Cleanliness; and 4. Morale of the kitchen crew.

Councilmen Takeshi Yatabe and James Nishimura were appointed by Tsune Baba, Council chairman, to collaborate with the youth guidance committee in setting up a juvenile delinquency prevention program. Dr. Russell WeHara, a member of the City Commission, was also requested to assist in the delinquency prevention program.
