NEWCOMERS WELCOMED

HAWAIIANS SETTLED IN BLOCK 1

A warm welcome was extended to the 226 former residents of the Hawaiian Islands upon their arrival in Topaz Sunday morning. The group, consisting of 176 unattached men and the rest family units, arrived on a special train at Delta at 7:35 in the morning where they were welcomed by Assistant Project Director James F. Hughes and other members of the administrative staff.

The carrier service started for Topaz at 8 o'clock with the first contingent, and the last car was checked in at 9:15. The new residents were housed in Block 1 after induction ceremonies in the Block 1 dining hall. Upon their arrival, they were first given refreshments by a committee of residents. They then went through the process of a brief medical examination, after which the Boy Scouts conducted them to their apartments.

After resting for the remainder of the day, the newcomers were the guests of honor at a reception and entertainment program in Dining Hall 1 attended by the new residents and members of the administrative staff. Mike Maruyama presided as chairman and Rev. T. Goto gave the invocation. Project Director Charles F. Ernst welcomed the newcomers briefly.

Tsune Baba, chairman of the Community Council, extended the welcome of the residents to the Islanders, and a response was delivered by Takaichi Sakai, a member of the Hawaiian group.

Sakai said, "We of the Hawaiian group who have come to live among you
