## MILLARD COUNTY JAIL BREAK FOILED BY FORMER RESIDENT

Genjiro Morizawa, prisoner at the Millard County Jail, was instrumental in preventing a jail break and bloodshed last Saturday, according to a letter received by Ralph Barnhart, project attorney, from Milton A. Melville, Millard County attorney.

### 9 INTERNEES JOIN FAMILIES

Nine internees released from the internment camp at Santa Fe, New Mexico, arrived in Topaz Saturday to be reunited with their families, it was announced today.

The group, together with nine others who returned during May and June, were given a welcome by Charles F. Ernst, project director, who advised them about the center's arrangements and procedures.

Those who returned Saturday are Hirotaka Ichiyasu, Koshiro Nakabayashi, Toshio Nakata, Masazo Furuya, Assemon Muramoto, Magotaro Hirose, Iwajiro Shimizu, Fred M. Murakoshi, and his son, Akira.

Morizawa, who was sentenced for 60 days on June 16 for assault and battery, "overheard 2 white prisoners being held for auto theft plotting to stab the jailer as he came in with the evening meal and then make their escape," Melville wrote.

"However, before the evening meal was served," the letter continued, "another prisoner was brought to the jail and Morizawa was able to get out of the jail and inform the officers of the plot. As a result, it was foiled.

### MODEL PRISONER

"Morizawa has been a model prisoner," Melville revealed. "He has kept the jail clean. He has worked around the court house grounds. He has been strictly honest and obedient in all ways.

"On account of his good conduct and service to us in foiling the break, we want to recommend that we either turn Morizawa back to Topaz or that he be released to carry on some kind of work for which he is adapted.

### MORIZAWA PRAISED

"It is such conduct as Morizawa has displayed here that will prove to the American people that the Japanese here in America are good citizens and by so doing they will win back the respect that they have partially lost due to the war that is now being fought," he concluded.


