JOHN E. SKOGLUND: He has taught at the Central Baptist Seminary, Ottawa University and the Berkeley Baptist Divinity School for the past 3 years.

He received his A.B. at the University of California in 1933, and his Ph.D. at Yale University in 1939.

DR. F. W. HECKELMAN: He is a returned Methodist missionary from Japan where he served as a professor at the Aoyama Gakuin in Tokyo.


