#### RESOLUTION ON EVACUEES PASSED

The California state board of agriculture last week passed a resolution approving the return of Japanese Americans and their families to the West Coast state after military authorities approve their return. The resolution presented to the board by Professor Paul S. Taylor of the University of Califortwo other members.

Governor Earl Warren, James F. Armstrong, Los Angeles member, and others strongly opposed the act, stating that it would create internal strife in the state rather than assist in the war effort.
