GREAT DEFENSIVE CASABA FRACAS WON BY BLOCK 27

What will probably be the lowest scoring AA cage clash was played Tuesday night when the star-studded block 27 quint muffled the hapless blocks 22-23 hoopsters, 10 to 3, in a National league tilt.

Both teams played great defensive games. Their smooth ball handling and feinting held the spectators spellbound, especially the clever block 27

melon tossers. However, as far as shooting was concerned, both quintets were way off, missing the bucket like a near-sighted man threading a needle.

At the end of the initial stanza, the score was 2 to 1 in favor of the #27 stalwarts, who led by virtue of a pair of free tosses. The man-to-man defenses employed by both contingents had each other's scoring machines well smothered.

In the second spasm, the two teams were held scoreless, a phenomenon that can only be attributed either to the remarkable defensive strategies of the participants or to their masterful restraint while shooting.

In the third frame, the block 27 contingent managed to sneak a couple of baskets with Ken Hosokawa and Bachi Suzuki playing the leading roles, while holding the blocks 22-23 cagesters scoreless.

Moto Takahashi opened the 4th quarter by sinking a goal followed by Suzuki, who was high point man with 5 tallies. Suzuki made a free throw good before Bob Iwata sank the first and only bucket for blocks 22-23. That ended the scoring for both teams.
