ERNST ISSUES: STATEMENT ON SELECTIVE SERVICE

The following statement, clarifying certain points concerning selective service in Topaz, was released by Charles F. Ernst, project director, this morning:

OPEN LETTER TO COUNCIL AND RESIDENTS OF TOPAZ

Several questions coming out of the recent War Department and Selective Service announcements have been brought to my attention. In order to help residents understand the situation I am making a few definite statements as follows:

1. The War Department, through the Army Examining

board, decides who is "acceptable".
2. The War Department notifies the Selective Ser-

vice System whois "acceptable".

3. The Local Board No. 30 of Millard County located at Fillmore wrote to the WRA at Topaz on January 29, fall 1944, and indicated the names of 120 men and one woman who were "acceptable".

4. The Chairman of the Local Board No. 30 WRA at Topaz to furnish him "with the current address of each 'acceptable' registrant" and to have certain forms filled out by these registrants and returned to the Fillmore Board.

5. Neither the Project Director nor any member of the administration have been told the basis on which show their appreciation in the Army Examining Board determines that a man is "ac-

ceptable".

6. The WRA will be very glad to receive from the residents any further questions and will endeavor to obtain the answers immediately through the Washington office. The Project Director has already asked the City Council to bring in any questions which come to its attention.
