TRANSPLANTING OF VEGETABLE SETS NOW UNDER WAY

TENTATIVE PROGRAM FOR SPRING FESTIVAL PLANNED

Approximately 100,000 cabbage plants and 70,000 tomato plants in the greenhouses are being reset in to individual growing boxes, according to the agricultural section. Resetting of broccoli and celery plants will begin soon.

The use of the new greenhouses in starting vegetable plants is a great improvement for the truck crop unit, stated Wendell Palmer, farm section chief. He pointed out that this year's plants were of finer quality than those bought for about \$6000 from the outside last year.

LEAVE CLEARANCE HEARINGS BEING CONDUCTED AT TULE LAKE CENTER

Leave clearance hearings are being held at the Tule Lake Center for those who have not previously been denied leave clearance by the national director of WRA and who now wish to establish their eligibility for relocation, according to a recent announcement made at the segregation center by Ray B. Best, project director.

Hearings will be held as rapidly as possible and recommendations of the hearing board and project director will be forwarded to Washington for final action by the national director.

The tentative program for the coming center-wide spring festival from May 7 to 13 has been planned, according to Raymond P. Sanford, assistant project director.

86 TOPAZ MEN PASS PHYSICALS

Eighty six men of the 128 from Topaz who reported for their pre-induction physical examinations on April 13 at Fort Douglas were accepted for general service, according to a final report received by Corlies R. Carter, head of Board #30 in Topaz. Three others failed to report; 10 were accepted for limited service and 32 were rejected.

All four persons, registered with the Fillmore board who reported on April 12, passed their physicals.

tor. If leave clearance is granted, applicants will be transferred to a relocation center from which they will be eligible for indefinite leave.

Persons who had received leave clearance before segregation and who remained at Tule Lake or were transferred there for family or special reasons, and who now wish to leave the segregation center, will be permitted to make new application for leave.

At the same time, it was pointed out that persons who have been denied leave clearance may appeal such decisions. A special Board of Appeals has been set up to hear such cases and to make recommendations to the director.

The training also makes it possible to relocate as a child's nurse, and in some states as a practical nurse. Convalescent homes, children centers, as well as some hospitals would be eager to accept the services of attendants with the training and experience the Topaz Hospital gives to their attendants and nurses' aides.

SUIT FILED AGAINST FEDERAL GOV'T

A suit against the federal government for payment for land acquired by WRA in Topaz is being prepared by Hillard County, according to the Salt Lake Tribune.

Milton A. Melville, Hillard county attorney reported to the state attorney general Grover A. Giles that the government took possession of the Topaz area, which includes 6700 acres of land acquired by the county on tax deed. The county gave the government an option to buy the land for \$1 per acre, but the option has not been exercised.

"The government has our land; we have nothing," Melville stated.

The nisei seamen will be used by the US merchant marine for sailing from the east coast.

日系人の問題

現在米國の法廷に提出された二つの訴訟事件は五吾寺米國人が吾寺の同僚日系市民に對する取扱ひに法に關する問題を提議してゐる。

此の渡合衆國大憲法院は是等の事件中の一つたるあの異味液爆撃後西部沿岸から九つの日系人を撤退させた。デヴォット中将の排折命令の合法性を誠意とする是松事件として知られてゐる事件に關する調査報告類一切の移送命令状を發する事になつた。

退者の憲法上の權利を侵害して無差別の拘留を取つたと云ふ諷刺的論が起つて来た。而して今二弟三弟の件は目下第九區巡回裁判所に提起了れたる人身保護法適用請願に關する遠藤事件として知られてゐる状態と直接關係ある件である。一度彼等が西部沿岸から撤退させらるゝや彼等根拠を以て居る人々が住むべき適當なる場所が用意する事が勿論必要となつたのである。彼等撤退日本人は皆彼等の家庭と職業を奪はれた。

米國政府はこれらの撤退日系人に適當な食糧と住宅をも保護を與へた。けれども併し彼等はバナーワイヤーの關の中に殆んど犯罪人の様に生活すべく餘而かも彼等は何等の罪状に由つて告發されたこともなければ又執刑の法廷に於ても何の裁きも受ける事なくしてゐた。
