SPRING FESTIVAL INAUGURATION SET TOMORROW

The community-wide Spring Festival which is being held from May 5 to 14 will be officially initiated at the All-Star softball game tomorrow afternoon from 1:15 at block 15. Roscoe Bell, acting project director, will give the opening address and throw the first ball to start the two-game series.

Exhibits are being held today and tomorrow by the sewing school and the Red Cross group at rec 5, and the flower arrangement classes in the auditorium. Recs 6 and 38 will be open today and tomorrow to all goh and shogi enthusiasts. The Senior Girl Reserves will sponsor a leap year dance, the Girls' Drag, tonight at dining hall 32 from 8:30.

One hundred and forty-two inductees will be honored at the second induction banquet to be given by the USO and city council at DH 19 Monday night from 6:30.

A talent show will be sponsored by the CAS on Monday and Tuesday nights at the auditorium from 7:30. All persons who wish to appear on the program are asked to apply at rec 3. Prizes will be awarded to the winners.

The farm section will give a program Tuesday and Wednesday. The block managers will make an educational tour of the farm Tuesday and 300 residents will be invited to make the same tour on Wednesday. The nursery workers will hold open house on the 2 days and residents are invited to visit the nursery near the hospital laundry.

WATER SERVICE MENACED; MORE WORKERS NEEDED

Pending the completion of necessary work on the water pipelines, Topaz is threatened with an interruption of water service which would be a serious menace to community health and fire protection. The main line between the tanks and the center is in such bad condition that a blow-out in this line is possible. If this occurs water supply for the en-

tire center would be cut off during the period of replacement, according to Henry R. Watson, senior engineer. Twenty-three fire hydrants are now out of service because the pipelines are deteriorated to the point that they cannot carry water, Watson also stressed.

He stated that although considerable progress has been made in the replacement of the pipelines since last fall in the hospital, warehouse area and other sections of the center, a large portion of the replacement work is still incomplete because of the shortage of workers. Relocation has taken all of the pipeline workers. Foreman Harry Yamasaki stated that 20 additional workers are needed to complete seven projects for the pipeline replacement program. It was stressed that hard working pipeline crews under Harry Yamasaki and Jiggs Yamada were responsible for the replacement jobs already finished.

A trencher has been contracted for a week's work but cannot be utilized without an adequate personnel to make connections and do other work rapidly to avoid having a dangerous open trench across the center for an unnecessarily long period.

Additional pipeline workers must be recruited immediately so that the trencher can be used while it is available. Watson

Wirin stated in his letter that he is willing to speak before a group on the "constitutional rights of Japanese, particularly American citizens of Japanese ancestry."

The two gates leading from the center into the military area, one opposite block 7 and the other east of the hospital, have been permanently closed and locked to both vehicular and pedestrian traffic, it was announced by Lieut. Frank W. Woodmansee, commanding officer of the military post at Topaz.

The closing was necessitated by the increasing traffic other than military which was using these gates to cross the military area.

All persons leaving or entering the center must hereafter use the other established gates.

(Continued from page 1) stated that the payment of the \$19 rate to these men has been authorized by the project director.

The following program is proposed to correct the situation:

1. Complete auxiliary line which connects well #6 in block 28. This temporary line has been laid because of the danger which exists due to the deteriorated condition of the main supply line from the water tanks to the camp.

2. Tie in the cast iron line on Jasper Avenue into blocks 19, 20, 26, 27, and 28. The cast iron lines for these 5 blocks have been in for 3 months and should be tied into the blocks as soon as possible.

3. Replace the main supply line consisting of 545 feet of 10" pipe from the water tanks to the camp near block 14.

4. Install the blow-off line at the southwest corner of block 26 so that the sand which has accumulated can be moved out of the water system to prevent the scaling up conditions in the boilers and hot water tanks.

5. Replace the 3,710 feet of 6" line on Opal Avenue.

6. Replace two blocks of 6" fire hydrant line on Juniper Street between Opal and Jasper avenues.

7. Replace 2 blocks of fire hydrant lines on Sage between Opal and Jasper avenues.

MANZANAR FREE PRESS



ALL-STAR TEAMS MEET TOMORROW AFTERNOON
