# FOURTEEN RE-ELECTED FOR NEW TERM OF COUNCIL

Thirty-two new councilmen were elected yesterday by the residents to represent their respective blocks in the fourth term of the community council, it was reported today by Masuji Fujii, office manager. Block 30 did not hold a nomination meeting, therefore no election was held. Block 14 also did not conduct an election.

Official election returns show that only four of the new councilmen are citizens, while the remainder are issei. Thirteen of the 14 re-elected councilmen won by acclamation. Three others also won by acclamation.

The newly elected council will take office early next month.

### 1000 En Route To Gila And Ht Mt.

SAW FRANCISCO, June 12-As a step toward closing the Jerome relocation center in Arkansas, 1000 residents were on their way Monday to other centers, the War Relocation Authority announced.

About 500 were en route to the Heart Mountain center, and the other 500 were bound for Gila River.

Other groups will be sent to the Rowher in Arkansas. Jerome is expected to be closed by June 30.

Dr. Collier succeeds Dr. J. A. Simpson who resigned to go to Washington last month. In the absence of a chief medical officer, Dr. A. Pressman, on leave from Gila has been in charge of the local hospital.

# SEASONAL WORK CONDITIONS IN PROVO REPORTED

Farm crops and conditions in the Provo area are not as favorable as last year, it was stated by Emil Sekerak at a seasonal leave meeting held last night in block 32. Approximately 225 persons attended the meeting.

About 250 to 300 workers from Topaz are wanted to harvest farm crops in Utah County. Smithfield in Cache County requires laborers. The first group of 100 workers will leave for seasonal work on June 17 and the second group is scheduled for June 23. Persons interested in leaving on the first group sign up tonight at DH 32 from 7:30 PM.

### OREM CAMP

According to an investigation conducted over the week end by Sekerak, Donald Egr, Mas Narahera and Frank Yamazeki, the Orem camp is physically better than the Provo camp last year. The camp provides tents which eight men, showers and adequate sanitation. However, the food is not too good and no recreation facilities are offered. charge for board is \$1.20 per day and 50¢ per week for room.

### CROP HARVESTS

The first crop to be harvested will be strawberries from June 15 to July 1. 30¢ to 35¢ will be paid per case, according to the crop. The second crop will be sour and sweet cherries which are fairly full and will last from July 1 to 31. A fair raspberry crop will be harvested from July 15 to August 15.
