

\$1500 GOAL SET FOR APPOINTED STAFF BOND DRIVE

With the goal set for \$1500, the appointed personnel began its fifth war bond drive on June 12, according to Doren Boyce, finance section head. Each person will contribute over 40 per cent of one month's salary to the campaign.

In conjunction with the drive, the members of the appointed staff held a party last night with the theme, "Fifth War Bond Drive".

Boyce stated that approximately three-fourths of the goal has already been attained.

Due to the unsettled weather, planting and harvesting have been delayed. However, the general outlook for the coming harvests are very good and it is hoped that there will be a steady flow of greens through summer, he said.

VIOLATION OF ALIEN LAND LAW TO BE INVESTIGATED

As preliminary steps in starting a campaign to investigate violations of the Alien Land Law in California, attorneys representing the law enforcement agencies in that state have recently visited some of the

relocation centers to obtain information from evacuees. Reports sent from the West Coast to the Washington WRA indicate that a campaign may be undertaken to investigate violations in California, Washington, and Oregon and that escheat proceedings may be filed by the states in numerous cases.

PASADENANS

Help Offered To Returning Evacuees

One-hundred-fifty letters promising to help evacuees when they return to California were recently sent to the War Department to residents of Pasadena, according to word received here today. The sending of these letters was initiated by the Friends of the American Way of Pasadena, Mary T. MacNair of the organization reported.

The letters promised 50 jobs and 125 homes, permanent and temporary, to the returning Japanese Americans. The American Way group indicated hopes of starting similar movements in other West Coast communities.

In view of the WRA's responsibility in assisting evacuees in protecting their property interests, Dillon Myer, national WRA director, sent the following advices to evacuees who may be requested to give information to the investigators.

1. The WRA will assist evacuees in employing a private attorney to advise them with respect to investigations.

INTERVIEWS

2. They have a legal right to refuse to give any information whatever to the law enforcement agencies unless they are subpoenaed in a regular manner. They should be informed, however, that refusal to give information might cause their cases to receive more attention than they would otherwise, since their refusal to give information may be interpreted to mean that they are concealing important evidence.

3. Under the laws of California, Washington and Oregon it is permissible for United States citizens to hold land. In many instances where citizens hold land, the land was purchased by alien parents. It is permissible under these laws for a parent to

(Continued from page 1) purchase land for his child, if it is intended that the child be the actual owner. However, if placing in the child, the title to the land was intended merely to be a subterfuge to evade the Alien Land Law while retaining actual full control over the lands and income from them in the alien parent who paid the purchase price, the State may be able to escheat those lands.

4. To prosecute successfully escheat proceedings in these cases, it will often be necessary for the law enforcement agencies to rely upon evidence ob-

tained from the evacuees. The transcripts of the interviews may be used very effectively (especially in cross-examination) by the State in trying escheat cases, if the information given in the interview is contrary to the testimony of the evacuee at the trial. It is, therefore, important that each evacuee be advised that if the transfer of land to a citizen was not in fact a subterfuge and the evacuee wishes to explain the transaction at the interview, he should be careful to explain fully all the facts showing that no violation of the Alien Land Law is involved.

Taking high batting honors were C. Yamada and H. Ikebuchi.

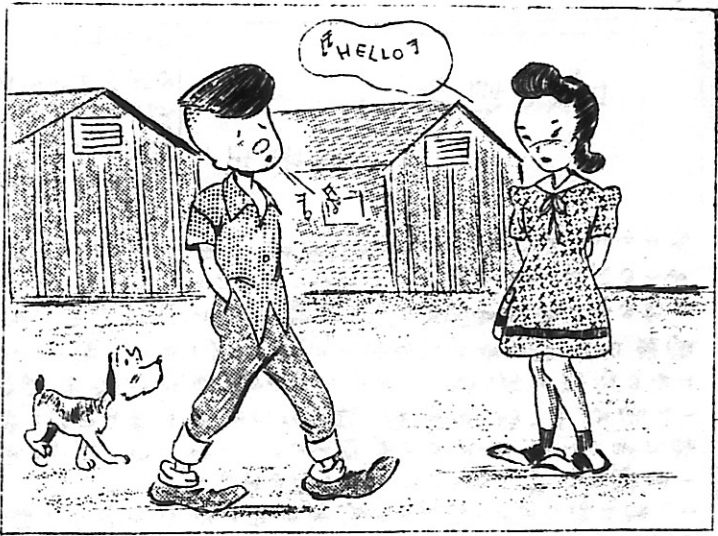

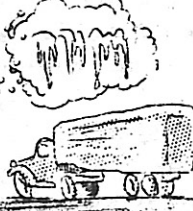
