SCIENCE BUILDING CONSTRUCTION IS 60% FINISHED

The high school science building located in the southwest corner of the high school plaza is 60 per cent complete, according to J. F. Hopkins, assistant superintendent of construction. The crew is working to finish the building before school opens again.

The men will begin work on the ceiling Monday. Partitions must also be put up and the building must be painted to complete the job, Hopkins stated.

The 50 x 187 feet building will house the domestic science, typing, physics, chemistry, and crafts classes.

TOPAZ AND WAR

War and its horrible meanings struck closer to home this week as the War Department telegrams announced that sons and husbands of Topaz residents have been injured and killed in action in the Fifth Army's drive to Livorno in Italy during the earlier part of this month.

This time will not be the last time that the people of Topaz will hear of their loved ones in the battle becoming casualties; modern mechanized war takes its toll of lives and casualties quickly and indiscriminately.

The reasons why these men volunteered to serve in a Japanese American Combat Team of the US Army have been told to us many times. The nisei on the home front must make sure that the efforts and sacrifices of these nisei soldiers are not in vain.

We pay tribute to Tom Misumi, who died in action, and to the many other nisei soldiers of the 442nd Infantry Battalion, who are fighting for their country and the nisei's future.

PATRIOTISM TEST

Recently 11 wounded men from Bushnell General hospital were feted in Salt Lake City. All were Japanese Americans who had seen service in the Italian campaign. Most of them lost an arm or a leg and were sent to Bushnell for the fitting of artificial limbs.

It may have been something of a surprise to many Utahns to read about these Americans of Japanese ancestry and their fighting record in Uncle Sam's Army. But these 11 are only a few of the hundreds of Japanese Americans who have fought bravely for their country--America--been killed, wounded and taken prisoner, praised for performing "brilliantly" in action and decorated for gallantry.

The first Japanese American combat unit, the 100th Infantry battalion, was activated in May, 1942. It first went into action about a year ago. Since then up to last May, members of this one battalion, fighting in many engagements and singled out for high praise in a 5th army citation, have received 900 purple hearts, 3 distinguished service crosses, 36 silver stars and 21 bronze stars.

Japanese Americans have seen plenty of action in this war on many fronts. A Japanese technical sergeant in the air forces has won 2 distinguished flying crosses and an air medal with 5 oak leaf clusters for his gunnery work on more than 25 European theater bombing missions. Japanese Americans are serving as interpreters, radio intelligence men and in other capacities all over the Pacific war theater. They have seen action on Bataan, at Tarawa, Kwajalein, New Guinea, Guadalcanal, New Britain and in the China-Burma-India theater.

There are today approximately 13,000 soldiers of Japanese ancestry in the army, more than half of whom are now outside the continental US.

No one can say, after the record of volunteering for service, of gallantry in action of blood sacrifice, that the second generation of Japanese in America have not in large numbers proved their loyalty to their country by their readiness to serve in its armed forces, to fight for it, and to die for it. What more conclusive test of patriotism is there?

SIGNIFICANCE OF EXPATRIATION LAW TO NISEI TOLD

Prior to its recent adjournment, Congress adopted a bill amending the Nationality laws to simplify the method by which citizens of the United States may voluntarily renounce their citizenship. On July 3 the bill was signed by the President and became a law.

Under the new law an American citizen may renounce his citizenship by making a statement to that effect on a form to be prescribed by the US Attorney General, and before an officer designated by the Attorney General as not being contrary to the interests of national defense, which means that persons subject to the selective service act will not be able to use the law as a device for evading service in the armed forces.

The new law will not become fully operative until publication by the Department of Justice of the necessary regulations, development of the necessary forms and designation of the officers authorized to accept the forms. The law will be effective only while the United States is at war.

CAUTION

DO NOT DESTROY MIGRATORY BIRDS

Center residents are cautioned by WRA against violating federal regulations covering the capture or killing of migratory birds.

Under provisions of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, it is a criminal offense to hunt, capture, kill, sell, buy or transport any migratory bird protected by treaties with Great Britain and Mexico.

Officials of the Fish and Wildlife Service indicate that some center evacuees have unknowingly captured birds protected under these treaties. The birds must be liberated immediately or evacuees possessing them will be subject to a fine up to \$500 and/or imprisonment up to six months as provided by the Migratory Bird Act.

20 MORE NURSES' AIDES NEEDED AT LOCAL HOSP.

In order to continue the efficient nursing service now being given at the local hospital, at least 20 more nurses' aides are needed immediately, it

was announced today by Miss Augusta N. Kirchner. A minimum of sixty full-time nurses' aides are necessary to give adequate care to the patients.

At the present time, there are 37 aides working full-time and 5 on part-time basis. With the return to school in September of 22 girls of the present staff the nurses' aide shortage situation will become increasingly critical.

To curb a difficult situation in the near future, women between the ages of 18 to 60, in good health, whether issei or nisei, interested in this type of work are asked to apply at the hospital nursing office between 1 and 3 PM daily.

Nurses' aide work consists of rendering different services and care of patients in obstetrics, pediatrics, men's, communicable diseases wards, clinic and surgery.

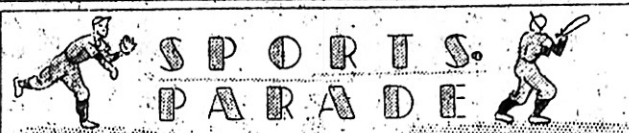
Chalking up their third victory blk. 29-30 ten clipped the blk. 28-31 squad, 5 to 7 at the blk. 30 diamond.

此委員会は第一の主眼として、当市全住民の健康と幸福の爲め、重要な奉仕的作業を滞りなく継続せんが爲め、各作業部門の就働人員の調節を圖り、各員の努力を最も有効的ならしむる様どの人力問題の研究討議を進める苦である。
