PROTECTED BIRDS LISTED AT BARNHART'S OFFICE

Many inquiries from residents have come to the project attorney's office asking if particular species of birds are migratory birds protected by the Ligratory Bird Treaty Act as announced in the Topaz Times of last Saturday. A list of migratory hirds has been received here and residents may consult it at the project attorney's office.

Project Attorney Ralph C. Barnhart points out further that under section 30-0-60 of the Utah code, it is unlawful to take; kill, ensnare, net, trap, or shoot at any native or in this imported bird state except game birds in season and cortain birds destroying crops.

State laws are fully atplicable in the center, according to Barnhart.
